The purpose of this paper is to support the 'Recording Traditional Knowledge for Natural Resource Management in the Avon River Basin" by providing a rudimentary analysis of literature about traditional Noongar land use and management, including attachment, cultural, physical and spiritual aspects, within the Avon River Basin.

This document is also a resource for regional NRM staff and land managers to promote current recommended practice regarding the management of *noongar* sites of significance in the Avon Basin. It briefly outlines the history of shared engagement in the land over approximately one hundred years, as one economy gave way to another.

This change in economies coincided dramatically with changes in the landscape; some changes that NRM is now trying to deal with to restore the health to country. It also summarises the legislation relevant to the Project, so that NRM staff can be fully aware of their legal responsibilities when working with Aboriginal sites.
