CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1) Each entrant may submit up to 4 original works. Only 3 works may be entered in any one category.
- 2) Entrants must be residents of Western Australia.
- 3) Work must be original, completed since Jan. 2017, and not previously exhibited in the Avon Valley. Craft must be designed by the entrant and made by hand, or with the use of appropriate and necessary tools.

Works from commercial kits or plans are not eligible.

- 4) Works must be suitably presented to exhibition standard. Hung artworks and craftworks, framed or unframed, should not exceed 1.5m in either dimension, including frame if any, and should be ready to hang with secure fittings and wire or cord as applicable.
- 5) Mosaic works entered in Category 11 must not exceed 1m in height or width for wallhanging items or 1 x1m of floor space for free -standing items.
- 6) All works except those from "Young Achievers" must be for sale. Asking price must include the 27.5% commission levied by the York Society.

It is desirable, but not obligatory that entries from "Young Achievers" be for sale.

- 7) An entry ID must be attached to the back bottom L-H corner of each work. ID labels will be sent to you by email where possible. otherwise by Australia Post, on receipt of your entry form and fee, approx. two weeks before the Exhibition. Any changes to titles or prices should be made at least one week prior to the Exhibition.
- 8) Entry Forms must be accompanied by a cheque or money order made out to The York Society, Inc., at the rate of \$16.50 (incl. GST) per work (\$11 for Young Achiever entrants) and must be received by the Society by 19th September, 2018. No late registration will be accepted and the entry fee will not be refundable.
- 9) The judging panel will view all entries received, but the organisers reserve the right to select works for exhibition, and some entries may not be exhibited. If, in the judges' opinion, there is no entry of an adequate standard in a section, they may refrain from making an award. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 10) The organisers may permit any work to be photographed for publicity, York Society catalogue or archival publications.

Delivery:

- 11) Entries should be delivered to the York Town Hall 11am -3.00pm, Saturday 6th October or Sunday 87h October or 10am -4pm Monday 8th October or Tuesday 9th October, or mailed to the York Society, PO Box 587, York, 6302 or delivered by Courier to the York Town Hall to arrive within the above dates. Suggested couriers are Quality Transport/Kal Express, 9358 1666, Stirling Freight Express, 94792555 and Australia Post Courier Service, 13 76 78. No works will be accepted after these dates.
- 12) Works may be delivered earlier than the above dates by prior arrangement. Ring Ken, 0455 779 431.
- 13) Works must be securely packaged and delivered free of all charges to us. No payment whatsoever shall be made by the York Society for freight or other charges incurred in the delivery or return of exhibits.

All packages and wrappings must be clearly marked with the name and address of entrant and number of items contained.

Collection:

- 14) Works may be collected only from Society stewards at the Town Hall from 3.45-5.00pm on Sunday, October 21st, or Monday, October 22nd, 10am-3pm. Other times must be arranged by appointment, ph. 0428 322 167 or 0455 779 431. After 30 days, unclaimed work will become the property of the York Society. Persons other than entrants or purchasers may collect works only with written authority. Alternatively, works will be dispatched to you if you have arranged and prepaid a courier service or they may be sent to you by Australia Post COD.
- 15) Entries may not be removed from the Town Hall before 3.45pm, Sunday, October 21st. Sold works may be picked up at 3.45pm.

Insurance:

16) Entrants are responsible for arranging their own insurance. The York Society will take all reasonable care with submitted works, but shall not be responsible for loss or damage to works while they are in the custody of the Society or its agents.

AWARD FOR AN ARTWORK **DEPICTING 'BLANDSTOWN'** (\$500)

This prize was inaugurated in 2009 for a work in one of the following categories:

- 1. Painting, Oil or Acrylic
- 2. Painting, Watercolour
- 3 Drawing
- 4. Pastels

The work must depict a building or some other aspect of the area of York known as 'Blandstown'.

This area is bounded by Henrietta St/ Balladong Rd, the Railway Line, Knotts Rd and the Avon River. The area also includes the Residency Museum and the Old York Hospital in Brook St. A map showing the boundaries of Blandstown can be found on the reverse of this page and on the website.
