

WELCOME TO YORK AND OUR EXCITING JAM-PACKED HERITAGE WEEKEND. EARLY BIRDS CAN EASE THEMSELVES GENTLY INTO A WEEKEND OF CELEBRATIONS IN WA'S OLDEST SETTLED INLAND TOWN.

All heritage events and displays are free thanks to the generosity of local businesses and our sponsors the York Business Association, The York Society, Bendigo Bank and the Shire of York.

8am-11am Make an early start and enjoy a traditional breakfast in an idyllic setting by the Avon River at the Carriage Diner in South Street.

Call into the Visitor information centre at the Town Hall to check out the location map and don't forget to collect the family Quiz for the whole family to solve & a chance to win a super prize, a special York Gift Pack. Check out these & other new events that have been added – Wildflower Society Bushland garden Tour & History & Cultural Tours of York by Dr. Marion Kickett. All details and times of these & more at the Town Hall.

Then visit our world class Motor Museum open daily 9am-4pm. There could be a Quiz clue here!

Visit the newly opened Court House precinct made up of the Court house, the Museum and the Gaol for an in depth look into the history of York and the important contribution made by the local Noongar people.

Browse the historic buildings and shop displays along the Terrace and don't forget to check for Quiz answers. Then grab lunch at Jules and later perhaps a beer at the Castle before the evening celebrations.

6pm Gather at the Town hall for the famous York Ghost Walk conducted by our local ghost buster Mike. Walk approx. 45 minutes finishing up at Settlers for the evening.

There will be a few brief and well chosen words to launch this exciting weekend event before an evening of music and entertainment.

Enjoy a traditional dinner at Settlers and check out this interesting historic building and it's past and get ready for all tomorrows great activities!

BREAKING NEWS. Members of the WA Historical Cycling Club will be in York on Saturday and Sunday. You can chat to them at the old Saints Diner where they will have several historic bicycles for you to see and then on Sunday there will be a parade of original Penny Farthings around the town. This is a great opportunity to learn some of the history of cycling in West Australia & share stories.







Grab a traditional breakfast at the Carriage Diner by the Avon River from 8am.If that is too early try "Gather" at the Old Mill from 9am check out one of York's most interesting historic buildings and don't forget to visit the Emporium.

9AM-4PM Visit our world class Motor museum & see the centre piece of their display for the weekend a 1901 Benz complete with wooden chassis. wheel spokes and body, it was imported into WA in 1902. Just one of the incredible range of vehicles on display.

10AM-2PM RSL Anzac Display at the Memorial Rose Garden Avon Terrace. Great display of memorabilia with lots of great photo opportunities with two life size WW1 soldier cut outs.

10AM-3PM Meet our local 'whitesmith' at Corrugated farm & watch her upcycle 100yr old corrugated iron, fencing wire and rusty barbed wire to create amazing art for your garden or home.

10 AM-4PM All day Zoo at the back of the Court House. A rare chance to see different animals and birds up close and personal and find out all about them from the Zoo keeper.

9AM-12MD Saturday is sausage tasting on the barbecue at York's award winning butcher's shop showcasing their terrific range of flavours with something for every palate. Pick your favourite and take a couple of kgs home.
