President's Column

National Reconciliation Week 2025 is held from Tuesday 27 May to Tuesday 3 June. This is a time for all Australians to reflect on our shared and diverse histories, and to consider how we can contribute to reconciliation in our everyday lives.

In York, a number of local events took place throughout the week, including activities at the Environment Centre which was held on Saturday 31 May and Sunday 1 June. For a full list of Reconciliation Week events in York. please visit the Events section of the Shire's website.

As part of reconciliation efforts across the country, many public events now include a Welcome to Country or an Acknowledgement of Country. These are important cultural protocols that show respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

A Welcome to Country is delivered by a Traditional Owner or Elder and formally welcomes people onto their Country. An Acknowledgement of Country can be given by anyone and respectfully recognises the On Tuesday 27 May, the Shire of York was Traditional Owners of the land and their proud to receive a *Tier 2 Diligence in Safety* enduring connection to it.

We acknowledge the Traditional Owners of this land, who have lived here around 60,000 years. They were here long before us, and their connection to Country remains strong today.

Roadworks Complete

Following three months of construction, major works on Quellington Road and Goldfields Road have now been successfully completed.

On Quellington Road, a 1.8km section has been reconstructed, and the seal width has been increased to improve safety. Additionally, new shoulder works and drainage construction have been installed, providing safety enhancements to the area.

Similarly, on Goldfields Road, problematic bends have been addressed, and a 3.4km section has been widened. New line markings and wider lanes will reduce risks for drivers, particularly on those curves.

These upgrades will improve driving conditions and overall safety for all road users. We appreciate your patience and understanding during the construction period.

Planning for the 2025/26 road program will seek to continue this work.


This is your chance to tell us what matters most. How does our town better support older adults and young people?
