4 PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

4.2 Public Question Time

NEAL CROCKER

Question 1

Why is the Shire of York about to close the Black Spot Programme for Avon Terrace & Spencer Brook Road when key components such as drainage, curbing and footpath construction remain outstanding given that the Department of Infrastructure informs me that funding is still available.

Response provided by the Shire President

As has been mentioned to you in previous advice provided, the Avon Terrace—Spencers Brook Road project was funded by the Federal Black Spot Program, which is specifically designed to fund works that directly reduce the risk of crashes. The project aimed to reduce crash risks identified in a 2019 road safety inspection report. Since 2020, the Shire has managed the project focusing on addressing narrow lanes, poor line-marking, and limited

sight distances at intersections such as Bland Road and Water Street. The final design included shoulder widening, pavement reconstruction, upgraded line-marking and signage, and intersection improvements.

Although a footpath and kerbing was considered, they were not required to meet the safety objectives of the project and funds were instead directed to treatments that directly reduced crash risk. The project is now in its finalisation phase, with a variation request submitted to refine the original scope of works removing the treatments which did not contribute to safety improvements.

Question 2

My second question is directed to CEO Mr Linnell and his response to Councillor Denese Smythe when questioned as to why no funding has been allocated for drainage in the 25/26 budget at the Special Council Meeting on 12th August. Mr Linnel said "... that whole the Shire has operational funding, there are no capital projects for drainage, and that efforts are being made to "squeeze money out of the State Government for stormwater management.

Response provided by the Shire President

The CEO's response at that meeting was accurate. The Shire has operational funding to maintain stormwater, but there are no capital projects for new drainage infrastructure in the 2025/26 budget. The works you are referring to under the Blackspot funding were allocated under the 2024/25 budget and not the 2025/26 budget.

The Stormwater Management Plan mentioned by Mr Linnell at the Special Council Meeting on 12 August 2025 refers to a comprehensive strategy to address stormwater runoff as well as managing the natural hydrological processes that occur throughout the townsite. It is a holistic management strategy.

Question 3

Mr Linnell, are you aware that the Black Spot Programme for Avon Terrace & Spencers Brook Road already has been granted funding for drainage.

Response provided by the Chief Executive Officer

My comment to Cr Smythe related to projects within the 2025/26 budget, whereas the project you are referencing relates to 2024/25.

JANE FERRO

Question 1

In the July Edition of York Community Matters, there was a letter to the editor from Concerned York Residents inquiring about a planned development of 10 dwellings in the vacant lot that was previously a drive-in movie theatre. Many concerns and risk factors were identified if this development goes ahead.

If this is not just a rumour, is it true that final planning approval will not seek input from current local residents, neighbours or the Shire of York, but will be granted by the WA Planning Commission, in line with the current push by WA Labour to develop land for housing throughout Perth outwards to a radius of around 100 km?

Response provided by the Shire President

The Shire understands the land in question is currently undergoing a sale process, which is a matter between the owner and prospective purchaser and is a process the Shire has no responsibility for.

Any subdivision applications are lodged directly with the WA Planning Commission (WAPC), who then refer them to relevant State Government agencies and the relevant local

government for technical comments. The ultimate decision rests with the WAPC, not the relevant Council.

Following the sale process, if a subdivision approval is granted and a development application is later lodged for any of the proposed new lots, and if that proposal complies with the Residential Design Codes (R-Codes), it will generally not be advertised for public comment. In such cases, it is only referred internally (e.g., to the Shire's Heritage Consultant) and to other government agencies where relevant.

Question 2

What recourse do current local residents, neighbours and the Shire of York have to oppose this development?

Response provided by the Shire President

Local residents and neighbours do not have any formal right of appeal against a subdivision or compliant residential development approved by the WAPC or the Shire. The only party with a right of appeal is the applicant (the landowner/developer) if they are dissatisfied with a determination.

The Shire is able to make comments during the WAPC referral process, but it does not have decision-making authority on subdivisions.

DIANE BUCKLEY

Question 1

I have looked into the amount of staff leaving the Shire over the past year in particular. I can find some data for 2022 and 2023. I would like to know approx. how many have left the Shire in 2024/2025 and why is there such a high turnover?

Response provided by the Chief Executive Officer

Employment turnover is just below the 50% mark of industry standard. The Shire's turnover rate for the last financial year is around 26.8%, the industry standard was around 26.9% based on WALGA information. New Hire turnover is low at 10.5% with the average sitting at 25.6% and a high of 47.9% for local governments.

The Workforce Plan available on the Shire's website, provides three (3) years of benchmarked data as well as reasons for staff leaving the organisation. The updated Workforce Plan was presented to Council at its August 2025 Concept Forum and will be presented to the September 2025 Ordinary Meeting.

In summary, the Shire has an average turnover compared to other local governments.

Question 2

The Agenda briefing for this meeting was held at Green Hills, this was not posted on the Council Facebook page, why was this change of venue not advised to ratepayers and where are the minutes as I wanted to know how many attended?

Response provided by the Shire President

The Shire has historically held its Ordinary Meetings at Greenhills and Talbot Hall. The new legislative reforms require Council to record its Council Meetings, meaning that the Meetings can no longer be held at those locations, to maintain engagement with the community, Council resolved to conduct its Agenda Briefing, which are not required to be recorded at these locations.

Response provided by Chief Executive Officer

Council set its 2025 Meeting dates at its November 2024 Ordinary Meeting, which specified the August Agenda Briefing be held at Greenhills. This notice was published on the Shire's website on 6 January 2025.

The location for the August Agenda Briefing was also detailed in the email notice to Subscribers with the link to the August Ordinary Council Meeting Agenda. These notices are not posted on Facebook, as the website is the Shires one source of truth which is available for anyone to view.

NATURE OF COUNCIL'S ROLE IN THE MATTER

Legislative

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To consider an application to keep more than the prescribed number of dogs at Lot 197 (55) Macartney Street, York, in accordance with the provisions of Section 26(3) of the *Dog Act 1976*.

BACKGROUND

The Shire of York Dogs Local Law 2000 stipulates that the maximum number of dogs permitted to be kept on a premises within the townsite is two (2), unless an exemption is granted by Council under Section 26(3) of the Dog Act 1976.

Council has previously approved similar applications, including cases where objections were received, provided that the Shire Ranger or other authorised officer determined there were no valid reasons to refuse approval.

The applicant has been keeping three (3) dogs at the property for approximately five (5) weeks, following the purchase of a ten (10) week old puppy and a six (6) month old Blue Heeler x Kelpie.

On 9 July 2025, the Shire received an application for a 3–6 Dog Permit to keep three (3) dogs at Lot 197 (55) Macartney Street, York. The dogs are currently lifetime registered:

- 1. Merty Thirteen (13) year old Brown and Tan Male Kelpie (Tag LT0893)
- 2. Pirate Six (6) month old Blue and Black Male Blue Heeler × Kelpie (Tag LT0895)
- 3. Red Ten (10) week old Red Male Red Heeler (Tag LT0894)

The applicant advises that Merty has been a long-term companion, and the family's female dog passed away approximately eighteen (18) months ago. The two (2) young dogs have since been introduced, Pirate who was being rehomed, and Red. The young dogs provide companionship to each other, while the older dog helps to socialise and train them. The applicant states that they will maintain three (3) dogs only until the older dog passes away and the family do not intend to replace him.

COMMENTS AND DETAILS

Following receipt of the application, neighbour consultation was undertaken in accordance with Shire Policy C7 – Keeping of Three to Six Dogs, which requires written notification to properties within a 150-metre radius in Residential zones.

Seventeen (17) letters were sent, and three (3) submissions were received. One (1) verbal submission in support of the application, and two (2) written submissions in objection.

A property inspection on 10 July 2025 found the premises suitable for housing three (3) dogs. The inspection report is presented in Appendix 1.

OPTIONS

Council has the following options:

- **Option 1:** Council could choose to approve the application for three (3) dogs at Lot 197 (55) Macartney Street, York, subject to conditions.
- **Option 2:** Council could choose not to approve the application for three (3) dogs at Lot 197 (55) Macartney Street, York.

Option 1 is the recommended option.

IMPLICATIONS TO CONSIDER

Consultative

On 15 July 2025, correspondence was sent to seventeen (17) surrounding properties, advising they could notify the Shire of their feedback within a period of fourteen (14) days in relation to the application. One (1) verbal submission was received supporting the application and two (2) written submissions were received objecting. The submissions are presented in Appendix 2. A summary of the submissions is provided in the table below.

Policy Related

The property is zoned Residential R10/30. Policy C7 – Keeping of Three to Six Dogs provides standard conditions applicable to approvals.

Financial

There are no immediate financial implications for the Shire, aside from the administrative costs associated with processing the application which are provided for in the annual budget.

It is significant to note should the applicant be aggrieved by Council's final decision in this matter, they have the right seek a formal review of that decision by the State Administrative Tribunal. Should this occur, the Shire would need to respond. The cost to respond to an appeal cannot be determined at this preliminary stage but could be expected, based on the recent experience of other local government authorities in Western Australia, to range anywhere from \$5,000 to \$60,000 excluding GST depending upon how far the matter proceeds through the review process.

Legal and Statutory

Section 26(3) of the *Dog Act 1976* is applicable and states:

"26. Limitation as to numbers

- (1) A local government may, by a local law under this Act
 - (a) limit the number of dogs that have reached 3 months of age that can be kept in or at premises in the local government's district; or
 - (b) limit the number of dogs of a breed specified in the local law that can be kept in or at premises in the local government's district.
- (2) A local law mentioned in subsection (1)
 - (a) may limit the number of dogs that can be kept in or at premises to 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6 only; and
 - (b) cannot prevent the keeping in or at premises of one or 2 dogs that have reached 3 months of age and any pup of either of those dogs under that age; and
 - (c) cannot apply to dogs kept at premises that are licensed under section 27 as an approved kennel establishment; and
 - (d) cannot apply to dangerous dogs (declared) or dangerous dogs (restricted breed).
- (3) Where by a local law under this Act a local government has placed a limit on the keeping of dogs in any specified area but the local government is satisfied in relation to any premises that the provisions of this Act relating to approved kennel establishments need not be applied in the circumstances, the local government may grant an exemption in respect of those premises but any such exemption
 - (a) may be made subject to conditions, including a condition that it applies only to the dogs specified in the exemption; and
 - (b) cannot authorise the keeping in or at those premises of
 - (i) more than 6 dogs that have reached 3 months of age; or
 - (ii) a dog under that age unless it is a pup of a dog whose keeping is authorised by the exemption;

and

- (c) may be revoked or varied at any time.
- (4) A person must not keep in or at any premises, not being licensed under section 27 as an approved kennel establishment —

- (a) in the case of dogs that have reached 3 months of age, other than dangerous dogs (declared) or dangerous dogs (restricted breed), more than the number of dogs than the limit imposed under
 - (i) a local law mentioned in subsection (1); or
 - (ii) an exemption granted under subsection (3);

or

- (b) more than
 - (i) 2 dangerous dogs (declared); or
 - (ii) 2 dangerous dogs (restricted breed); or
 - (iii) one of each of those kinds of dangerous dogs,

that have reached 3 months of age; or

(c) any pup, of a dangerous dog (restricted breed), that is under 3 months of age.

Penalty:

- (a) for an offence relating to a dangerous dog
 - (i) a fine of \$10 000, but the minimum penalty is a fine of \$500;
 - (ii) for each separate and further offence committed by the person under the Interpretation Act 1984 section 71, a fine of \$500;
- (b) for an offence relating to a dog other than a dangerous dog
 - (i) a fine of \$5 000;
 - (ii) for each separate and further offence committed by the person under the Interpretation Act 1984 section 71, a fine of \$100.
- (5) Any person who is aggrieved
 - (a) by the conditions imposed in relation to any exemption under subsection (3); or
 - (b) by the refusal of a local government to grant such an exemption, or by the revocation of an exemption,

may apply to the State Administrative Tribunal for a review of the decision.

(6) An application under subsection (5) cannot be made later than the expiry of a period of 28 days after the day on which a notice of the decision is served on the person affected by that decision."

SHIRE OF YORK DOGS LOCAL LAW PART 3 - REQUIREMENTS AND LIMITATIONS ON THE KEEPING OF DOGS

- (1) This clause does not apply to premises which have been
 - (a) licensed under Part 4 as an approved kennel establishment; or
 - (b) granted an exemption under section 26(3) of the Act.
- (2) The limit on the number of dogs which may be kept on any premises is, for the purpose of section 26(4) of the Act
 - (a) 2 dogs over the age of 3 months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated within a townsite; or
 - (b) 4 dogs over the age of 3 months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated outside a townsite.

Risk Related

Keeping of three (3) dogs in a residential area may pose potential nuisance risks (noise, aggression, wandering). No such risks were substantiated during this assessment.

That, with regard to the Application to Keep Three (3) Dogs at Lot 197 (55) Macartney Street, York, Council:

- 1. Approves an exemption under Section 26(3) of the *Dog Act 1976* for the keeping of three (3) dogs at Lot 197 (55) Macartney Street, York, subject to the following conditions:
 - a. Dogs must not create a nuisance (e.g., barking, aggressive behaviour, wandering) to the satisfaction of the Shire of York.
 - b. The exemption applies only to the dogs stated on the application. Once any of the dogs are deceased, sold or otherwise disposed of, the exemption for that particular dog ceases to have effect.
 - c. The exemption will cease to have effect on the date of any conviction for an offence relating to the Dog Act 1976 in respect of any of the dogs, or any person in charge of those dogs.
 - d. The subject property must be kept clear of all animal excreta using proper disposal methods.
 - e. Adequate cover and protection are always to be available to the dogs.
 - f. The dogs are to be adequately confined in accordance with Section 3.1 of the Shire of York *Dogs Local Law 2000* and Dogs *Local Law 2012 Amendment*.
 - g. Access to the property is to be given to a Shire Officer for an annual inspection, or more regularly if the Shire so determines. Each inspection will be charged in accordance with the adopted Schedule of Fees and Charges.

FENCING Suitable

Materials used for fencing: Small ring lock surrounding the fence lines, none of the dogs can push through.

Height of fencing: 1.2m fencing with cocky gates in three (3) sections for access with cars.

Locking devices on gates: Latch hooks, small mesh fencing is installed under the gates to prevent the

dogs from escaping.

HOUSING Suitable

Means of housing: The dogs are outside throughout the day with plenty of shaded areas under

the patio and the trees.

Dogs are all inside in the evenings with their own bedding.

Bedding: Dogs are inside of a nighttime and have their own bedding in the lounge.

When outside they have plenty of areas to lay down in the sun and undercover

Water supply: Water supply and feed is good, a number of buckets and a black tub are

refreshed daily.

CONDITION OF EXISTING DOGS Suitable

Details: Each of the dogs are well looked after with good coats on all.

Merty is 13 years old and is a bit frail but still in good condition for a working dog. He is being used to help train the two (2) younger dogs for yard work also.

Ranger notes: Pirate, the Blue Heller X Kelpie is still quite young and has been known to jump

but the fencing is higher in parts of the property and has not shown any signs

of wanting to jump.

HISTORY: There is no history regarding any misbehaviour with the dogs.

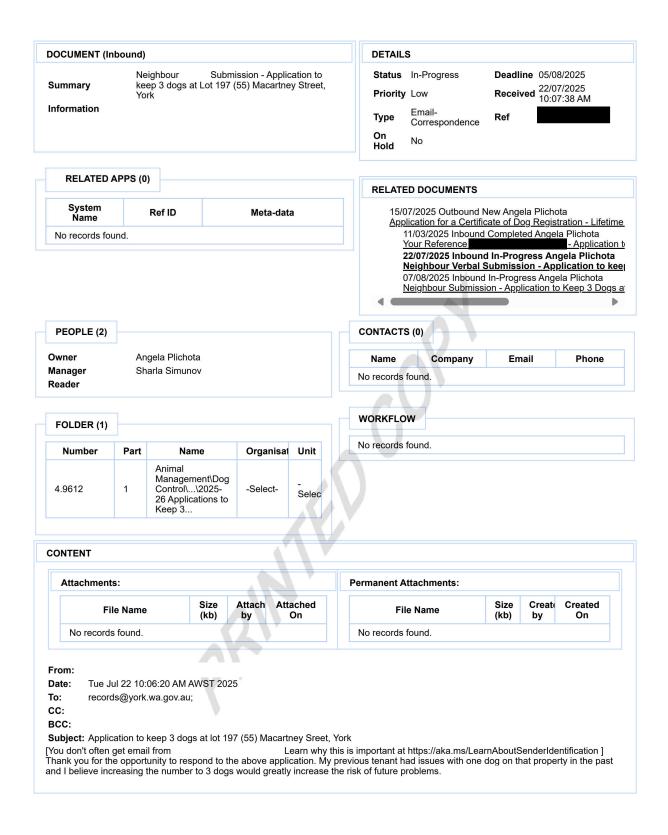
Merty has been a working dog now at 13 years old is getting frail. Pirate was obtained from a friend in Mullewa as their other dog did not like him. Red was

obtained to train up as a working dog for the family farm.

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend that the Shire approve the application to keep three (3) dogs at Lot 197 (55) Macartney Street, York in accordance with Section 26.3 of the *Dog Act 1976* with the following conditions:

- 1. Dogs must not create a nuisance (e.g., barking, aggressive behaviour, wandering) to the satisfaction of Council.
- 2. The exemption applies only to the dogs stated on the application. Once any of the dogs are deceased, sold or otherwise disposed of, the exemption for that particular dog ceases to have effect.
- 3. The exemption will cease to have effect on the date of any conviction for an offence relating to the *Dog Act 1976* in respect of any of the dogs, or any person in charge of those dogs.
- 4. The subject property must be kept clear of all animal excreta using proper disposal methods.
- 5. Adequate cover and protection are always to be available to the dogs.
- 6. The dogs are to be adequately confined in accordance with Section 3.1 of the Shire of York *Dogs Local Law 2000* and *Dogs Local Law 2012 Amendment*.
- 7. Access to the property is to be given to a Shire Officer for an annual inspection, or more regularly if the Shire so determines. Each inspection will be charged in accordance with the adopted Schedule of Fees and Charges.

NATURE OF COUNCIL'S ROLE IN THE MATTER

Executive

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report provides an update of the York Bowling Club (YBC) management of the York Recreation and Convention Centre (YRCC) bar and function area, confirming signing of the lease and presentation of the wage expenditure to date.

BACKGROUND

At its May 2025 Ordinary Meeting, Council resolved (020525):

"That, with regard to Operational Management of the York Recreation & Convention Centre, Council:

- 1. Agrees to the lease with York Bowling Club Inc (the Lessee), as presented in confidential Appendix 2, for the portion of Lot 292 on Plan 103094, York, for the purpose of operating the York Recreation and Convention Centre Bar and Function Area in accordance with the following essential lease terms:
 - a. A term of one (1) year commencing 5 September 2024.
 - b. Option to renew for a further one (1), one (1) year term.
 - c. Permitted Purpose to be used for bar and function services for the York community in line with the current approved liquor licence and lease agreement.
 - d. Public Liability insurance of not less than ten million (\$10,000,000) to be the responsibility of the Lessee.
- 2. Requests the Chief Executive Officer to advertise the proposal to lease management of the York Recreation and Convention Centre Bar and Function area for public submissions.
- 3. Authorises the Shire President and Chief Executive Officer to endorse the lease documentation and apply the common seal, as per the terms and conditions of the lease, subject to no objections to the proposal to lease being received.

- 4. Requests the Chief Executive Officer to include an amount of \$5,000 per month for salary support for the York Bowling Club in the 2025/26 budget process, subject to the signing of the lease agreement.
- 5. Notes actions taken regarding the York Bowling Club's management arrangement of the bar and function service at the York Recreation & Convention Centre.
- 6. Directs the Chief Executive Officer to provide Council with an update on progress at its August 2025 Ordinary Meeting."

COMMENTS AND DETAILS

In accordance with the above resolution, the following actions have been undertaken since May 2025:

1. Legal and Contractual - Management Agreement for the YBC

The proposal to lease management of the YRCC Bar and Function area to the YBC was advertised in the York Community Matters July edition. A copy of the advertisement is presented in Appendix 1. The invitation for public comment remained open until Monday 21 July 2025. No public submissions were received by the Shire regarding the proposal during this time.

On Tuesday 29 July 2025, the YBC's President and Treasurer joined the Shire President, Chief Executive Officer and Executive Manager Corporate & Community Services at the Shire Administration to sign the lease agreement. This occasion was captured and shared with the wider community via the Shire of York website "Latest News" section and Facebook page.

2. Budget

The YBC have submitted the monthly salary support reports up until 30 June 2025. A summary table from September 2024 to June 2025 is presented in confidential Appendix 2.

As per Resolution 020525, the YBC will submit a formal acceptance of the reduced salary support rate of \$5,000 per month and the twelve (12) month extension of the lease agreement, commencing 5 September 2025. Any commitment to further funding would be based on the acquittal of the \$40,000 start-up grant.

3. General

The YBC have now operated the bar and function area of the YRCC for nearly twelve (12) months. Over the last ten (10) months, the YBC have provided an average of 130 paid service hours per month accompanied by a high volume of volunteer hours, demonstrating an average of 150 volunteer hours a month in May and June. The YBC have provided a reliable service for regular users and community function bookings, continuing to work towards combined volunteer support from the other sporting clubs.

With the agreement now signed, YBC will commence the submission of a general monthly report to accompany the wages report, providing further feedback on the daily operations, maintenance requirements and volunteer involvement.

As required by Section 4.2 (1) of the signed agreement, the YBC will provide the Shire a copy of the independently reviewed financial statements for the YRCC Bar and Function area operations covering 2024/25 once they are received by YBC.

OPTIONS

Council has the following options:

- **Option 1:** Council could choose to note the actions taken to attain signing of the lease agreement and ongoing management outcomes by the YBC of the bar and function area at the YRCC.
- **Option 2:** Council could choose to request additional information regarding the management of the YRCC by the YBC.

NATURE OF COUNCIL'S ROLE IN THE MATTER

Executive

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report presents the acquittal received for the York Christmas Festival Inc.'s (YCFI) annual Christmas Festival, held in Peace Park on 7 December 2024, for Council review.

BACKGROUND

Council has historically provided support for activities, organisations and events that contribute to the Shire's community, social and economic objectives through the Community Funding Program.

In certain circumstances, where Council sees significant benefit to the community of maintaining support for a project or activity on an on-going basis it may resolve to consider, via the Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework review cycle or the Annual Budget process, inclusion as a Multiyear Funding Agreement (MFA).

At its 22 October 2024 Ordinary Meeting, Council considered the application for a new MFA for YCFI and resolved (031024):

"That, with regard to the York Christmas Festival Inc. - Request for new Multiyear Funding Agreement, Council:

- 1. Receives the request for multiyear funding from York Christmas Festival Inc, as presented in confidential Appendix 1.
- 2. Requests the Chief Executive Officer to negotiate a multi-year funding agreement with the Christmas Festival Inc under the following conditions:
 - a. The Agreement will commence on 1 November 2024 and expire on 30 June 2027.
 - b. The amount of sponsorship will be provided in accordance with the table below:

- c. Payment will be subject to all milestone conditions of the Agreement being met on an annual basis.
- 3. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to make any necessary minor typographical and formatting changes to the multiyear funding agreement prior to signing.
- 4. Authorises the Shire President and Chief Executive Officer to endorse the final multiyear funding agreement.
- 5. Directs the Chief Executive Officer to include the above agreed amounts in the 2025/26 and 2026/27 budgeting process."

On 2 December 2024 a new MFA was awarded to YCFI in accordance with Resolution 031024.

Acquittal reporting is a requirement of sponsorship. Dependant on the size, scale and frequency of funding, acquittal reporting detail varies. At minimum acquittal reports must include:

- 1. Key outcomes
- 2. Lessons learned
- 3. Community benefits
- 4. How the Shire was acknowledged
- 5. Budget detailing how the monies were spent

A summary of the YCFI's sponsorship acquittal for delivery of the 2024 Christmas Festival, year 1 of its MFA, is presented in Appendix 1. Supporting acquittal documentation is presented in confidential Appendix 2.

COMMENTS AND DETAILS

Council committed a contribution of \$16,750 to support delivery of the 2024 York Christmas Festival and Residential Christmas Lights Competition, with the following outcomes:

- 1. The York Christmas Festival ran a whole of community event at Peace Park on Saturday 7 December 2024, providing fun and free Christmas entertainment for the community and local businesses in a safe and relaxed family environment.
- 2. Event organisers estimate 750 attendees. However, as it is a free event it is difficult to provide accurate data.
- 3. The Shire of York was acknowledged for its contribution in social media, posters/flyers and letters to supporters.
- 4. \$750 of Shire funding was specifically allocated for the Christmas Light competition prizes. This was acknowledged on promotional materials and on the list of entrant addresses circulated to community. The winners, from Alfred Street and Herbert Road, were announced at the Christmas Festival.

The YCFI report a total income of \$19,330 from combined Shire funding (subject to final acquittal approval) and donations, against a total expenditure of \$19,865. Supporting documentation has been provided with the acquittal report.

The current MFA sets milestone payments as 90% upfront and 10% upon successful acquittal. The usual split for Community Funding and MFAs is 80% upfront and 20% upon successful acquittal. However, as Shire funding comprises approximately 86% of the total event budget, this arrangement better assists the event organisers to cover the cost of deposits and fees required to book entertainers and amusements in advance.

Key Lessons Learnt:

This event has been run for nearly twenty (20) years in Peace Park and the community thoroughly enjoy the afternoon and evening. However, the event takes considerable time and effort to organise and has relied largely on the help from friends and volunteers to assist with delivery. Although the YCFI have had great pleasure in doing the event over the years, things have gotten harder and the Event Coordinator has formally advised that YCFI will no longer be able to deliver the event.

The YCFI have written to the Shire to formally request the cancellation of its current MFA for 2025/26 and 2026/27 and have expressed a desire for the Shire of York to host the event in the future due to its positive impact on community and visitors. A report will be presented to Council's September 2025 Ordinary meeting regarding that proposal with details of what may be possible.

Option 1: Council could choose not to accept the acquittal as presented in Appendix 1.

Option 2: Council could choose to seek further details from the funded organisation.

Option 3: Council could choose to accept the acquittal as received.

Key Lessons Learned:

Environmental work can be affected by climate influences such as long hot/dry summers and short growing seasons which has made it hard to coordinate revegetation projects and overlapping weed control operations.

Growing concern from community and RCS members regarding the use of herbicides along the river has resulted in the RCS upgrading weed control equipment and reducing the purchase of herbicides.

In Summary:

- 1. The RSC have fulfilled its obligations with all outcomes achieved.
- 2. The Shire's contribution of \$12,972 represents 18% of the total overall project value of \$72,188.76. All funds were expended.
- 3. A detailed financial breakdown, schedule of activities and photos has been provided and is presented in Appendix 1.
- 4. All workshops, presentations and planting events were well attended with a total of approximately 150–180 attendees overall for the year.
- 5. The RCS has maintained a healthy membership base of just over 100 financial members.
- 6. The Shire is acknowledged for its contribution through social media, RCS newsletters, flyers and brochures, on the RCS website, in speeches and by word of mouth through general conversations.

Welcome to our Spring Edition

It has been a short but busy time since our last newsletter. Due to the late winter rains, we have had to squeeze a lot into a shortened planting and growing season. However, our RCS members and community volunteers have managed to plant 3,000 native seedlings on Tanjinn Well Reserve (Mt. Hardey) and at Baker's Lake, a shire reserve on Avon Terrace in York. Fauna nesting boxes have also been installed.

Members have been busy removing African Boxthorn along the river and working closely with the Shire of York, DFES and the Ballardong Aboriginal Corporation Rangers to burn the remaining biomass.

Year one of our three-year, Shire of York funding has been acquitted and we continue to work closely with the Shire over the coming years.

Work on the EDC continues and it has been named, the Gogulyar Bilya (Avon River) Environmental Discovery Centre, with signage and a new entrance installed on Glebe Street. Construction of the Gogulyar Bilya information trellis in the EDC grounds has been completed and signage about the river is being prepared with the help of members of the local Ballardong community.

Members continue to plant and nurture native plants in our environmental education precinct at the EDC.

The RCS has held several successful workshops and events at the EDC and has been involved in promoting the environment through events such as River Walks at the York Festival.

Our State NRM sponsored Rakali project continues. Now that the river level is dropping, we will again deploy wildlife cameras on the river pools to monitor our fragile Rakali population.

Our Containers for Change team continue to do a fantastic job and these proceeds assist us in our environmental work and the EDC development.

We recently held a successful outing on Drummond Gum Reserve. We plan to continue these outings on other reserves to inform members about our ten managed conservation reserves.

The RCS is continuing to look after the environment along the river walk trails & our conservation reserves. We have also consulted with the SoY on several projects to ensure satisfactory environmental outcomes.

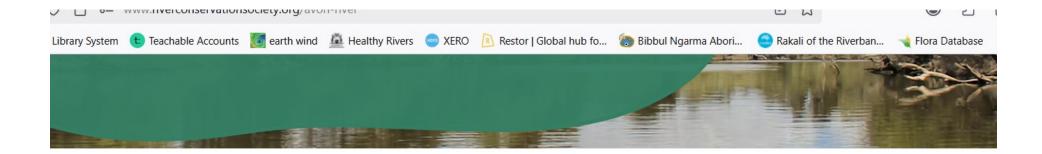

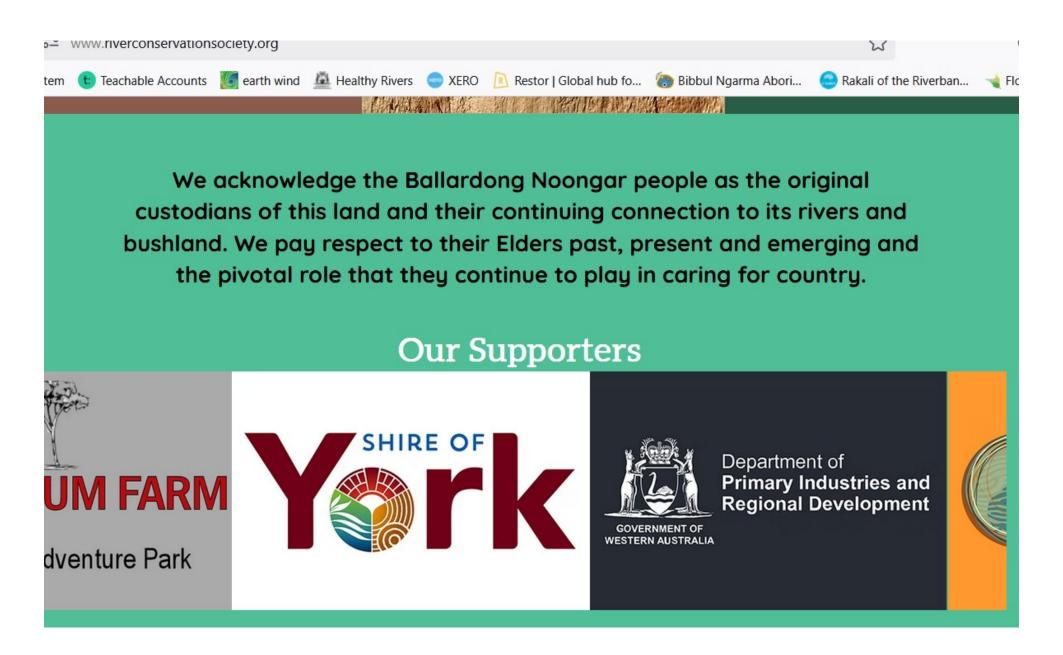

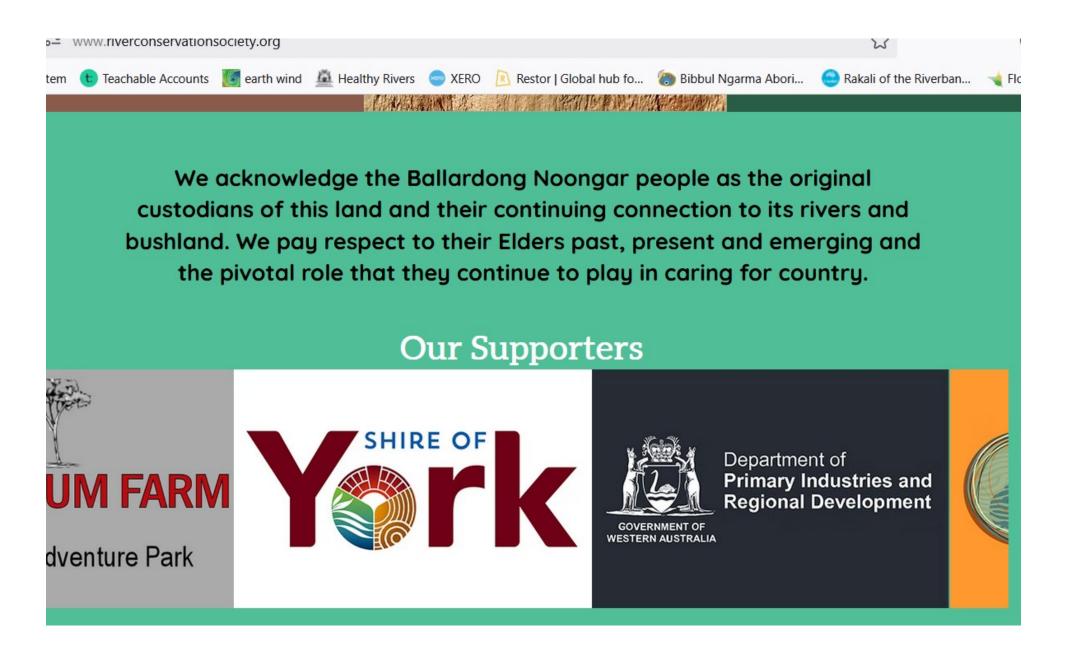

NATURE OF COUNCIL'S ROLE IN THE MATTER

Executive

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report presents a proposed lease of Lot S90 and part lots S91, S97 and S98 on Deposited Plan 223250 (the Land) to Wheatbelt Regional Carriage Driving Inc (WRCDC), for the purpose of equestrian activities, including but not limited to carriage driving, riding, training, competition, education, recreational use and uses ancillary thereto. The Shire of York is to be a co-lessor with York Racing Inc (YR).

BACKGROUND

The Land, highlighted in the below aerial image, is conditional tenure land pursuant to Section 72 of the *Land Administration Act 1997* (LAA), previously known as 'Crown Grant in Trust'.



The land can only be used for the specific purpose outlined in the Crown Grant in Trust. In this instance, the purpose is specified as "solely for the purpose of a Racecourse". Any proposed lease would need to align with this purpose.

Under Section 75(5) of the LAA consent of the Minister of Lands is required to lease this land.

At its June 2025 Ordinary Meeting, Council considered WRCDC's request for use and resolved (050625):

"That, with regard to 'Request for Use - Lots S90, S91, S97 and S98 on Deposited Plan 223250 - Wheatbelt Regional Carriage Driving Club Inc', Council:

- 1. Resolves to provide in principle support for Wheatbelt Regional Carriage Driving Club Inc to use Lots S90, S91, S97 and S98 on Deposited Plan 223250 via a lease agreement in consultation with York Racing Inc and surrounding property owners.
- 2. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to commence negotiations with York Racing Inc and Wheatbelt Regional Carriage Driving Club Inc to develop a lease agreement for the use of Lots S90, S91, S97 and S98 on Deposited Plan 223250.
- 3. Requests the Chief Executive Officer to advertise the proposal to dispose of Lots S90, S91, S97 and S98 on Deposited Plan 223250, for the purpose of equestrian activities, for public submissions in accordance with Section 3.58 of the Local Government Act 1995.
- 4. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to request approval from the Minister for Lands to enter into a lease agreement with York Racing Inc and Wheatbelt Regional Carriage Driving Club Inc for the use of Lots S90, S91, S97 and S98 on Deposited Plan 223250, should a lease agreement be negotiated.
- 5. Notes that the negotiated lease, and any public submissions received, will be presented to Council for consideration and determination"

COMMENTS AND DETAILS

Whilst not required under the *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act), to provide transparency and good governance, the Shire locally advertised its intent to enter into a lease with WRCDC, inviting submissions from 1 July 2025 to 21 July 2025. No submissions were received.

The primary proposed purpose and use of the land is for equestrian activities, including but not limited to:

- 1. Carriage driving
- 2. Riding
- 3. Training
- 4. Competition
- 5. Education
- 6. Recreational use

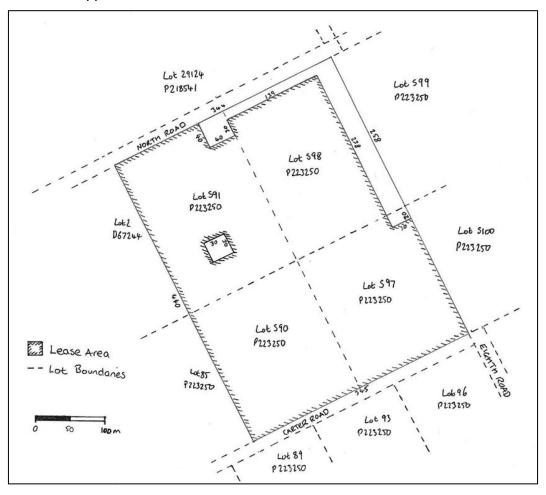
Additionally, WRCDC are requesting to use the land to support its operations as a not-for-profit entity, including fundraising activities, club educational activities and training sessions, and any other initiatives that align with the Lessor's objectives. Such activities would be considered ancillary to the main use of the land and purpose of the lease.

Officers have drafted a lease which is presented in confidential Appendix 1.

There are a couple of matters that have arisen since this proposed lease was considered by Council in June:

- 1. There is an existing water bore on Lot S91. YR have requested this area and access to the bore be excised from the lease area.
- 2. The Shire received a report that there is an area of approximately 900 square metres on Lot S91 where some building rubble is present, and concerns were raised that the presence of asbestos was uncertain.

Both the above areas have been removed from the proposed lease area, as can be seen within the sketch included as Appendix 1 of the draft lease and below:



In addition to the consent of the Minister for Lands, agreement from the committees of WRCDC and YR have been sought.

Their decisions are presented in Appendices 2 to 4 respectively.

Proposed Lease Terms

a. Purpose

Equestrian activities, including but not limited to carriage driving, riding, training, competition, education, and recreational use and uses ancillary thereto.

b. Rent

A Peppercorn rental of \$1 (plus GST) per annum is proposed for the term of the lease.

c. Term

An initial term of five (5) years is proposed commencing 1 September 2025 and expiring 31 August 2030 with the option of a further three (3) five (5) years terms. This is the Shire's standard lease term.

d. Insurance

The Lessee must effect and maintain the following insurances as a minimum:

- a. Public Liability of not less than twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000)
- b. Contents insurance to cover the Lessee's equipment
- c. Any applicable employer's insurance (for example, workers compensation insurance)
- d. Insurances to cover any damage and/or theft to the Lessee's property

The Shire (Lessor) is not required to take out or maintain any insurance in respect of the land or the improvements.

e. Rates

Includes local government rates, specified area rates, taxes, service and other charges and including charges for rubbish and garbage removal.

It is proposed through Council Resolution that rates be exempt during the term of the lease. However, the Emergency Services Levy and any other applicable charges, such as rubbish collection, are to be paid by the Lessee.

It should be noted that once Shire land is leased, it is no longer not rateable under Section 6.26(2)(b) of the Act. Therefore, unless a concession is granted by Council under Section 6.47 of the Act, rates are payable.

Officers therefore recommend that WRCDC be granted a concession from rates to bring it in line with other Shire of York community leases.

f. Firebreaks

WRCDC is responsible for the management of the land including installing and maintaining the firebreaks, in accordance with the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and the Lessor's reasonable requirements.

g. Development

Any development proposals would require a development approval and referral to the Heritage Council of WA.

A tributary of the Gogulyar Bilya/Avon River runs through the proposed lease area and is part of the Registered Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Place. If works or disturbance of this area is likely to occur, WRCDC may need to apply for a permit under Section 18 of the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972*.

h. Casual Hire

The lessee may hire out the Grounds on a casual basis, provided the use is consistent with the permitted purpose and the lessee obtains prior written consent from the Shire. Consent is also required if any camping is proposed.

OPTIONS

Council has the following options:

Option 1: Council could choose not to support the draft lease.

Option 2: Council could choose to agree to the draft lease and rates exemption and direct the Chief Executive Officer to conclude negotiations.

Option 3: Council could choose to agree to the draft lease and direct the Chief Executive Officer to conclude negotiations but disallow the rates exemption.

Option 2 is the recommended option.

Financial

There are some minor costs associated with registering the lease with Landgate.

The peppercorn rental applicable to the lease between the Shire and the WRCDC has been fixed at \$1 (plus GST) per annum. WRCDC will also pay a peppercorn rental of \$1 (plus GST) per annum to YR.

WRCDC is responsible for providing its own Public Liability insurance, insuring any building/structure that is placed on the land and also providing contents insurance.

Legal and Statutory

Sections 72 and 75(6) of the LAA relate to Leases of Crown Land and state:

"72. Terms used

In this Part —

conditional tenure land means land transferred in fee simple subject to conditions referred to in section 75(1), which land remains subject to those conditions;

employee has the same meaning as it has in the Public Sector Management Act 1994;

owner of a leasehold scheme has the meaning given in the Strata Titles Act 1985 section 3(1);

resolution without dissent has the meaning given in the Strata Titles Act 1985 section 3(1);

scheme by-laws has the meaning given in the Strata Titles Act 1985 section 3(1);

strata company has the meaning given in the Strata Titles Act 1985 section 3(1);

strata lease has the meaning given in the Strata Titles Act 1985 section 3(1)."

"75. Transfer of Crown land in fee simple subject to conditions...

. . .

(6) Conditional tenure land cannot become the subject of any lease, licence, mortgage, charge, security or other encumbrance without the written permission of the Minister, which may be given subject to conditions."

Section 3.58 of the *Local Government Act 1995* is applicable to the disposal of property and states:

"3.58. Disposing of property

(1) In this section —

dispose includes to sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of, whether absolutely or not;

property includes the whole or any part of the interest of a local government in property but does not include money.

- (2) Except as stated in this section, a local government can only dispose of property to
 - (a) the highest bidder at public auction; or
 - (b) the person who at public tender called by the local government makes what is, in the opinion of the local government, the most acceptable tender, whether or not it is the highest tender.
- (3) A local government can dispose of property other than under subsection (2) if, before agreeing to dispose of the property
 - (a) it gives local public notice of the proposed disposition
 - (i) describing the property concerned; and
 - (ii) giving details of the proposed disposition; and
 - (iii) inviting submissions to be made to the local government before a date to be specified in the notice, being a date not less than 2 weeks after the notice is first given;

and

- (b) it considers any submissions made to it before the date specified in the notice and, if its decision is made by the council or a committee, the decision and the reasons for it are recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which the decision was made.
- (4) The details of a proposed disposition that are required by subsection (3)(a)(ii) include
 - (a) the names of all other parties concerned; and
 - (b) the consideration to be received by the local government for the disposition; and
 - (c) the market value of the disposition
 - (i) as ascertained by a valuation carried out not more than 6 months before the proposed disposition; or
 - (ii) as declared by a resolution of the local government on the basis of a valuation carried out more than 6 months before the proposed disposition that the local government believes to be a true indication of the value at the time of the proposed disposition.

- (5) This section does not apply to
 - (a) a disposition of an interest in land under the Land Administration Act 1997 section 189 or 190; or
 - (b) a disposition of property in the course of carrying on a trading undertaking as defined in section 3.59; or
 - (c) anything that the local government provides to a particular person, for a fee or otherwise, in the performance of a function that it has under any written law; or
 - (d) any other disposition that is excluded by regulations from the application of this section."

Regulation 30 of the *Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996* is also applicable to property disposals and states:

"30. Dispositions of property excluded from Act s. 3.58 (Parts 1 & 2)

- (1) A disposition that is described in this regulation as an exempt disposition is excluded from the application of section 3.58 of the Act.
- (2) A disposition of land is an exempt disposition if
 - (b) the land is disposed of to a body, whether incorporated or not
 - (i) the objects of which are of a charitable, benevolent, religious, cultural, educational, recreational, sporting or other like nature; and
 - (ii) the members of which are not entitled or permitted to receive any pecuniary profit from the body's transactions."

Section 6.26 of the Act is applicable to rateable land and states:

"6.26. Rateable land

- (1) Except as provided in this section all land within a district is rateable land.
- (2) The following land is not rateable land
 - (a) land which is the property of the Crown and
 - (i) is being used or held for a public purpose; or
 - (ii) is unoccupied, except
 - (I) where any person is, under paragraph (e) of the definition of owner in section 1.4, the owner of the land other than by reason of that person being the holder of a prospecting licence held under the Mining Act 1978 in respect of land the area of which does not exceed 10 ha or a miscellaneous licence held under that Act: or
 - (II) where and to the extent and manner in which a person mentioned in paragraph (f) of the definition of owner in section 1.4 occupies or makes use of the land:

and

- (b) land in the district of a local government while it is owned by the local government and is used for the purposes of that local government other than for purposes of a trading undertaking (as that term is defined in and for the purpose of section 3.59) of the local government; and
- (c) land in a district while it is owned by a regional local government and is used for the purposes of that regional local government other than for the purposes of a trading undertaking (as that term is defined in and for the purpose of section 3.59) of the regional local government; and

- (d) land used or held exclusively by a religious body as a place of public worship or in relation to that worship, a place of residence of a minister of religion, a convent, nunnery or monastery, or occupied exclusively by a religious brotherhood or sisterhood; and
- (e) land used exclusively by a religious body as a school for the religious instruction of children; and
- (f) land used exclusively as a non-government school within the meaning of the School Education Act 1999; and
- (g) land used exclusively for charitable purposes; and
- (h) land vested in trustees for agricultural or horticultural show purposes; and
- (i) land owned by Co-operative Bulk Handling Limited or leased from the Crown or a statutory authority (within the meaning of that term in the Financial Management Act 2006) by that co-operative and used solely for the storage of grain where that co-operative has agreed in writing to make a contribution to the local government; and
- (j) land which is exempt from rates under any other written law; and
- (k) land which is declared by the Minister to be exempt from rates.
- (3) If Co-operative Bulk Handling Limited and the relevant local government cannot reach an agreement under subsection (2)(i) either that co-operative or the local government may refer the matter to the Minister for determination of the terms of the agreement and the decision of the Minister is final.
- (4) The Minister may from time to time, under subsection (2)(k), declare that any land or part of any land is exempt from rates and by subsequent declaration cancel or vary the declaration.
- (5) Notice of any declaration made under subsection (4) is to be published in the Gazette.
- (6) Land does not cease to be used exclusively for a purpose mentioned in subsection (2) merely because it is used occasionally for another purpose which is of a charitable, benevolent, religious or public nature."

Section 6.47 of the Act is applicable to rates concessions and states:

"6.47. Concessions

Subject to the Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Act 1992, a local government may at the time of imposing a rate or service charge or at a later date resolve to waive* a rate or service charge or resolve to grant other concessions in relation to a rate or service charge.

Risk Related

There is a moderate risk to Council if it does not have a lease in place and allows the activities to commence.

The Shire of York Local Planning Strategy, endorsed by the Western Australian Planning Commission in April 2025 refers to an Equine Precinct. This precinct is also identified in the Local Planning Scheme No. 3 as a Rural Residential Special Provisions area (RR4). This area is centred around the historic York Racecourse. The Strategy notes there is currently no adopted structure plan.

The Strategy suggests a Management Plan be developed for the area, which would identify a vision for the area and any facilities or infrastructure required to achieve that vision. Available funding is a limiting factor for the Shire.

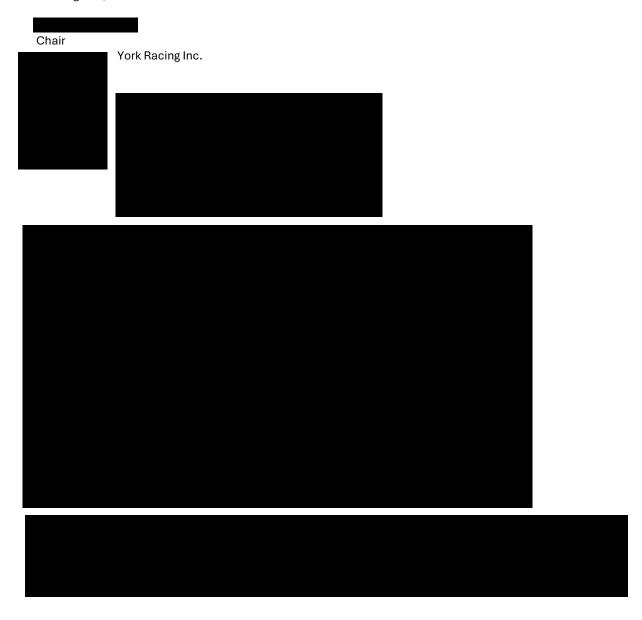

NATURE OF COUNCIL'S ROLE IN THE MATTER

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report presents the recruitment process for the role of Executive Manager Infrastructure and Development Services (EMIDS) to Council for noting.

BACKGROUND

Following the resignation of Mr Lindon Mellor from the position of EMIDS the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) is starting a recruitment process to fill the vacancy. Mr Mellor's last day with the Shire of York will be Friday 7 November 2025.

COMMENTS AND DETAILS

The CEO will prepare a Request for Quote in accordance with Policy F2 - Procurement, to facilitate the recruitment process for the role of EMIDS. It is anticipated the recruitment process will take between four (4) to six (6) months to complete. The process for recruitment will involve the following steps:

- 1. Conduct a procurement process to source a suitably qualified and experienced Recruitment Consultant.
- 2. Advertising of the role in accordance with statutory requirements.
- 3. Recruitment Consultant to prepare a shortlist of applicants for interview which is provided to the CEO.
- 4. The Selection Panel (determined by the CEO and including the Recruitment Consultant) will interview the shortlisted applicants.
- 5. Referee and due diligence checks undertaken by the Recruitment Consultant.
- 6. Recommendation Report provided to the CEO by the Recruitment Consultant.

When the process outlined above has been completed, a report will be presented to Council on the appointment of the preferred candidate in accordance with Section 5.37 of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

As the recruitment process will take some time, when layered with the current workload set out in the 2025/26 budget and the required recruitment for a new CEO, it is recommended that support is brought into the Shire of York Executive via the appointment of an Acting EMIDS, to commence following the departure of Mr Mellor on 7 November 2025. This will allow for a considered recruitment process to be undertaken. Depending upon the arrangements negotiated for this infill, costs may include salary, accommodation, subject matter expert support and agency fees. The Acting EMIDS role will be open for internal opportunity in the first instance, then via contractors if no internal appointment can be made.

In undertaking the recruitment process, the principles affecting employment by a local government as contained in Section 5.40 of the *Local Government Act 1995* will be used as guidance.

OPTIONS

Council has the following options:

- **Option 1**: Council could choose to direct the CEO to undertake the recruitment process for the substantive EMIDS in-house and to employ an Acting EMIDS until the recruitment process is complete. However, due to the position being a designated Senior Employee in accordance with Section 5.37(2) of the *Local Government Act 1995* conducting the recruitment process for the substantive EMIDS in-house could be perceived to cloud the transparency and independence of the process.
- **Option 2**: Council could choose to direct the CEO to undertake the recruitment process for the substantive EMIDS through an external HR consultant to maintain the transparency and independence of the process and to employ an Acting EMIDS until the recruitment process is complete.

Option 2 is the recommended option.

The 2025/26 budget includes an allocation for the recruitment of Executive staff at GL: 042169 - Consultants.

An allocation is also included for the payment of salaries etc applicable for employing Senior Employees.

Legal and Statutory

Sections 5.37, 5.39 and 5.40 of the *Local Government Act 1995* are applicable and state:

"5.37. Senior employees

- (1) A local government may designate employees or persons belonging to a class of employee to be senior employees.
- (2) The CEO is to inform the council of each proposal to employ or dismiss a senior employee, other than a senior employee referred to in section 5.39(1a), and the council may accept or reject the CEO's recommendation but if the council rejects a recommendation, it is to inform the CEO of the reasons for its doing so.
- (3) Unless subsection (4A) applies, if the position of a senior employee of a local government becomes vacant, it is to be advertised by the local government in the manner prescribed, and the advertisement is to contain such information with respect to the position as is prescribed.
- (4A) Subsection (3) does not require a position to be advertised if it is proposed that the position be filled by a person in a prescribed class.
 - (4) For the avoidance of doubt, subsection (3) does not impose a requirement to advertise a position where a contract referred to in section 5.39 is renewed."

"5.39. Contracts for CEO and senior employees

- (1) Subject to subsection (1a), the employment of a person who is a CEO or a senior employee is to be governed by a written contract in accordance with this section.
- (1a) Despite subsection (1)
 - (a) an employee may act in the position of a CEO or a senior employee for a term not exceeding one year without a written contract for the position in which the employee is acting; and
 - (b) a person may be employed by a local government as a senior employee for a term not exceeding 3 months, during any 2 year period, without a written contract.
 - (2) A contract under this section
 - (a) in the case of an acting or temporary position, cannot be for a term exceeding one year;
 - (b) in every other case, cannot be for a term exceeding 5 years.
 - (3) A contract under this section is of no effect unless
 - (a) the expiry date is specified in the contract; and
 - (b) there are specified in the contract performance criteria for the purpose of reviewing the person's performance; and
 - (c) any other matter that has been prescribed as a matter to be included in the contract has been included.
 - (4) A contract under this section is to be renewable and subject to subsection (5), may be varied.
 - (5) A provision in, or condition of, an agreement or arrangement has no effect if it purports to affect the application of any provision of this section.
 - (6) Nothing in subsection (2) or (3)(a) prevents a contract for a period that is within the limits set out in subsection 2(a) or (b) from being terminated within that period on the happening of an event specified in the contract.
 - (7) A CEO is to be paid or provided with such remuneration as is determined by the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal under the Salaries and Allowances Act 1975 section 7A.
 - (8) A local government is to ensure that subsection (7) is complied with in entering into, or renewing, a contract of employment with a CEO.

"5.40. Principles affecting employment by local governments

The following principles apply to a local government in respect of its employees —

- (a) employees are to be selected and promoted in accordance with the principles of merit and equity; and
- (b) no power with regard to matters affecting employees is to be exercised on the basis of nepotism or patronage; and
- (c) employees are to be treated fairly and consistently; and
- (d) there is to be no unlawful discrimination against employees or persons seeking employment by a local government on a ground referred to in the Equal Opportunity Act 1984 or on any other ground; and
- (e) employees are to be provided with safe and healthy working conditions in accordance with the Work Health and Safety Act 2020; and
 - (f) such other principles, not inconsistent with this Division, as may be prescribed."

The following information provides balances for key financial areas for the Shire of York's financial position as at 30 June 2025. The opening figures for this month's report have been updated to reflect the annual financial report.

To finalise the financial position to 30 June 2025, there is still work required on long service and annual leave entitlements, reconciling stock and the asset register. Most other annual accrual adjustments have been finalised.

List of Payments for June 2025

A list of accounts paid from the Municipal Fund and Trust Fund under the Chief Executive Officer's delegated authority for the month of June 2025 is presented to Council for noting.

Outstanding Rates and Services

The total outstanding rates balance as at 30 June 2025 was \$2,112,096 compared to \$1,807,671 as at 30 June 2024. Total outstanding rates are trending 17% higher than last year with no collection activity for two (2) years having a significant effect. There is an increase in the number of current debts who have received the usual reminders which should result in a reduction when collection activity starts.

Council has appointed an appropriately qualified and experienced debt collection contractor to assist in resolving both younger and older outstanding debts. Officers continue to administer payment arrangements outside of the ordinary payment options in line with the current Policy F1 - Revenue Collection.

Outstanding Sundry Debtors

The figure for total outstanding sundry debtors as at 30 June 2025 was \$130,528 compared to \$195,110 as at 30 June 2024. Sundry debtors aged debts are mostly made up of three (3) debtors who are being followed up for payment. Funds of \$60,500 were received in August settle one of those major balances. Aged debts are made up of a number of small debts with no single-issue dominating.

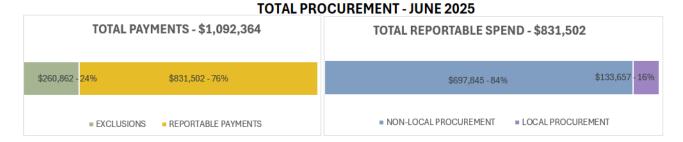

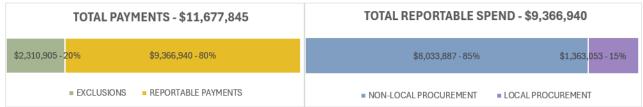

Financial

This report and its appendices provide a summary of the financial position of the Shire at the end of the reporting period. The figures reported are an estimate only and are subject to adjustments prior to finalisation of the 2024/25 annual financial report.

Legal and Statutory

Section 6.10 of the *Local Government Act 1995* is applicable and states:

"6.10. Financial management regulations

Regulations may provide for —

- (a) the security and banking of money received by a local government; and
- (b) the keeping of financial records by a local government; and
- (c) the management by a local government of its assets, liabilities and revenue; and
- (d) the general management of, and the authorisation of payments out of
 - (i) the municipal fund; and
 - (ii) the trust fund,

of a local government."

Regulations 13, 13A, 34 and 35 of the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996* are applicable and state:

"13. Payments from municipal fund or trust fund by CEO, CEO's duties as to etc.

- (1) If the local government has delegated to the CEO the exercise of its power to make payments from the municipal fund or the trust fund, a list of accounts paid by the CEO is to be prepared each month showing for each account paid since the last such list was prepared
 - (a) the payee's name; and
 - (b) the amount of the payment; and
 - (c) the date of the payment; and
 - (d) sufficient information to identify the transaction.
- (2) A list of accounts for approval to be paid is to be prepared each month showing
 - (a) for each account which requires council authorisation in that month
 - (i) the payee's name; and
 - (ii) the amount of the payment; and
 - (iii) sufficient information to identify the transaction;

and

- (b) the date of the meeting of the council to which the list is to be presented.
- (3) A list prepared under subregulation (1) or (2) is to be
 - (a) presented to the council at the next ordinary meeting of the council after the list is prepared; and
 - (b) recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

13A. Payments by employees via purchasing cards

- (1) If a local government has authorised an employee to use a credit, debit or other purchasing card, a list of payments made using the card must be prepared each month showing the following for each payment made since the last such list was prepared
 - (a) the payee's name;
 - (b) the amount of the payment;
 - (c) the date of the payment;
 - (d) sufficient information to identify the payment.
- (2) A list prepared under subregulation (1) must be
 - (a) presented to the council at the next ordinary meeting of the council after the list is prepared; and
 - (b) recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

34. Financial activity statement required each month (Act s. 6.4)

(1A) In this regulation —

committed assets means revenue unspent but set aside under the annual budget for a specific purpose.

- (1) A local government is to prepare each month a statement of financial activity reporting on the revenue and expenditure, as set out in the annual budget under regulation 22(1)(d), for the previous month (the **relevant month**) in the following detail
 - (a) annual budget estimates, taking into account any expenditure incurred for an additional purpose under section 6.8(1)(b) or (c); and
 - (b) budget estimates to the end of the relevant month; and
 - (c) actual amounts of expenditure, revenue and income to the end of the relevant month; and
 - (d) material variances between the comparable amounts referred to in paragraphs (b) and (c); and
 - (e) the net current assets at the end of the relevant month and a note containing a summary explaining the composition of the net current assets.
- (1B) The detail included under subregulation (1)(e) must be structured in the same way as the detail included in the annual budget under regulation 31(1) and (3)(a).
- (1C) Any information relating to exclusions from the calculation of a budget deficiency that is included as part of the budget estimates referred to in subregulation (1)(a) or (b) must be structured in the same way as the corresponding information included in the annual budget.
 - (2) Each statement of financial activity is to be accompanied by documents containing
 - [(a) deleted]
 - (b) an explanation of each of the material variances referred to in subregulation (1)(d); and
 - (c) such other supporting information as is considered relevant by the local government.
 - (3) The information in a statement of financial activity must be shown according to nature classification.
 - (4) A statement of financial activity, and the accompanying documents referred to in subregulation (2), are to be
 - (a) presented at an ordinary meeting of the council within 2 months after the end of the relevant month; and
 - (b) recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which it is presented.

(5) Each financial year, a local government is to adopt a percentage or value, calculated in accordance with the AAS, to be used in statements of financial activity for reporting material variances.

35. Financial position statement required each month

- (1) A local government must prepare each month a statement of financial position showing the financial position of the local government as at the last day of the previous month (the **previous month**) and
 - (a) the financial position of the local government as at the last day of the previous financial year; or
 - (b) if the previous month is June, the financial position of the local government as at the last day of the financial year before the previous financial year.
- (2) A statement of financial position must be
 - (a) presented at an ordinary meeting of the council within 2 months after the end of the previous month; and
 - (b) recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which it is presented."

Risk Related

It is a requirement of the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996* that local governments prepare a Statement of Financial Activity within two (2) months after the end of the reporting period. This report mitigates the risk of non-compliance with the Regulations.

1 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARATION

This prescribed financial report has been prepared in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995* and accompanying regulations.

Local Government Act 1995 requirements

Section 6.4(2) of the Local Government Act 1995 read with the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, prescribe that the financial report be prepared in accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 and, to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the Act, the Australian Accounting Standards. The Australian Accounting Standards (as they apply to local governments and not-for-profit entities) and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board were applied where no inconsistencies exist

The Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 specify that vested land is a right-of-use asset to be measured at cost, and is considered a zero cost concessionary leases. All right-of-use assets under zero cost concessionary leases are measured at zero cost rather than at fair value, except for vested improvements on concessionary land leases such as roads, buildings or other infrastructure which continue to be reported at fair value, as opposed to the vested land which is measured at zero cost. The measurement of vested improvements at fair value is a departure from AASB 16 which would have required the Shire to measure any vested improvements at zero cost.

Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, regulation 34 prescribes contents of the financial report. Supplementary information does not form part of the financial report.

Accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. Except for cash flow and rate setting information, the financial report has been prepared on the accrual basis and is based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and liabilities.

Actual results may differ from these estimates.

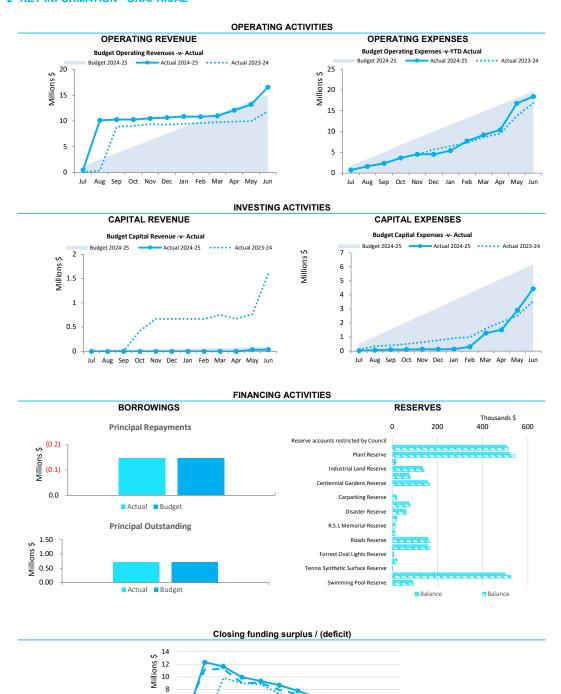

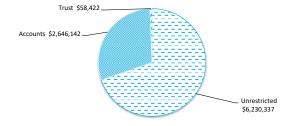

Initial recognition

An item of property, plant and equipment or infrastructure that qualifies for recognition as an asset is measured at its cost.

Upon initial recognition, cost is determined as the amount paid (or other consideration given) to acquire the assets, plus costs incidental to the acquisition. The cost of non-current assets constructed by the Shire includes the cost of all materials used in construction, direct labour on the project and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overheads. For assets acquired at zero cost or otherwise significantly less than fair value, cost is determined as fair value at the date of acquisition.

Assets for which the fair value as at the date of acquisition is under \$5,000 are not recognised as an asset in accordance with Local Government (Financial Management) Regulation 17A(5). These assets are expensed immediately.

Where multiple individual low value assets are purchased together as part of a larger asset or collectively forming a larger asset exceeding the threshold, the individual assets are recognised as one asset and capitalised.

Individual assets that are land, buildings and infrastructure acquired between scheduled revaluation dates of the asset class in accordance with the Shire's revaluation policy, are recognised at cost and disclosed as being at reportable value.

Measurement after recognition

Plant and equipment including furniture and equipment and right-of-use assets (other than vested improvements) are measured using the cost model as required under *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulation 17A(2)*. Assets held under the cost model are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses being their reportable value.

Reportable Value

In accordance with Local Government (Financial Management) Regulation 17A(2), the carrying amount of non-financial assets that are land and buildings classified as property, plant and equipment, investment properties, infrastructure or vested improvements that the local government controls.

Reportable value is for the purpose of *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulation 17A(4)* is the fair value of the asset at its last valuation date minus (to the extent applicable) the accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses in respect of the non-financial asset subsequent to its last valuation date.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Shire has a present legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Employee Related Provisions

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Shire's obligations for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly before 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries and sick leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

The Shire's obligations for short-term employee benefits such as wages, salaries and sick leave are recognised as a part of current trade and other payables in the calculation of net current assets.

Other long-term employee benefits

The Shire's obligations for employees' annual leave and long service leave entitlements are recognised as employee related provisions in the statement of financial position.

Long-term employee benefits are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Any remeasurements for changes in assumptions of obligations for other long-term employee benefits are recognised in profit or loss in the periods in which the changes occur. The Shire's obligations for long-term employee benefits are presented as non-current provisions in its statement of financial position, except where the Shire does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least 12 months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as current provisions.

Contract liabilities

An entity's obligation to transfer goods or services to a customer for which the entity has received consideration (or the amount is due) from the customer.

Capital grant/contribution liabilities
