Question 1:

Would the President please advise me how the 'Information Paper on Signage advising of the provisions of the Town Planning Scheme' in progressing.

Response Has been discussed. Waiting on Officers report.

Question 2: Has the Shire an expected date for its completion?

Response No.

Question 3:

What do the Councillors consider an acceptable time for the Shire of York administration to respond to a Ratepayers letter?

Response

It depends on the complexity of the information that needs to be provided.

Question 4:

Would Councillors consider 19 weeks – 94 working days unreasonable? Refer my letter dated 5th March, 2010.

Response Already answered.

Question 5:

Would the Shire explain the payment of \$17,802.10 made to Heatseeker Pty Ltd listed as York Visitors Centre for the 2009 Jazz Festival.

Response

Funds that were supposed to be held in trust by the York Visitor Centre. Funds paid out of operating account, which Council resolved to pay up to \$85,000.

Question 6: Was the \$17,802.10 paid to avert legal action?

Response

Yes. Between York Visitor Centre and Heatseekers and not the Shire of York.

Question 7:

As the York Tourist Bureau is incorporated – why are the Ratepayers of York funding their debts?

Response

The Council and the ratepayers have supported tourism, it is a part of York and to protect community groups which had funds in the Trust Account of York Visitor Centre.

Question 1:

(a) It would appear that signage can be a contentious issue within the Shire. Does the Shire follow its own Planning policies in relation to signage?

In the Shire minutes on 19th April, 2010 it states; quote

"It is also proposed to erect a 4.8 metre by 2.4 metre development sign on the northwestern end <u>of the property</u> promoting the development"

- (b) Why then did the Shire allow a 4.8 x 2.4 metre sign to be erected outside of the development boundary?
- (c) Is it fair to say then that the public would assume that when the Shire states the north-western end <u>of the property</u> this would relate to the property within the development boundary?
- (d) Would the Shire therefore agree, that the location of the sign did not comply with its own planning policies relating to signage?

Response

The placement of the sign was a temporary measure until earthworks were completed on the site and to avoid the Water Corporation and Telstra infrastructure. When site works are completed the sign would be moved to the North-West corner of the property.

Question 2:

- (a) Is the Shire duty-bound to answer correspondence from members of the public?
- (b) In the Shires opinion what is an acceptable period of time to answer correspondence?
- (c) Would the Shire agree that a period of eighteen weeks is unacceptable?

Question 1:

Are the Councillors aware of a previous monitor report by Christine Hardwick? Are the Council aware that the report applies to this Council? Any members being elected to Council are bound by this report.

Response

Council is bound by the Local Government Act and other legislation. No Ministers orders were issued in relation to the monitoring of the previous Councils.

Question 2:

Renovation of Town Hall does it include disability access? Is it being funded by Royalities or Local Council?

Response

A Committee has been formed and they are looking at a variety of funding. Council will apply for Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Program. Yes disabled access is being considered. Timelines will be published.

Question 3:

What is happening with regards to the Graffiti Project?

Response

The Graffiti project is not going anywhere at the present. It will be put out to the community for comment and it will then go to Council.

Question 4:

Will you personally fund the project if the graffiti project creates tagging?

Response Council already cleans up graffiti.

Question 1:

At the Special Council meeting of 7th July I presented several questions. Question 2 stated ... based on this quote, does the Shire commit to write to landowners/occupiers regarding issues and in turn, provide the courtesy of a response to correspondence received from those landowners/occupiers.

The response from the Shire President recorded in the minutes was yes. However you also stated that, as a Councillor you would not put pen to paper as quote 'you know the problems that causes'. Does this therefore mean that as Councillors collectively, you refuse to or cannot correspond in writing, if so, which applies?

Response

I do not commit to writing letters in response to individual matters. There is a set process for correspondence to the Shire of York.

Question 2:

Following on from my first question, it is my understanding that the Shire President can correspond on behalf of the Councillors collectively. If this is the case, has the Shire President delegated authority to the CEO to respond to all communication addressed personally to Councillors? Alternatively, does another government body control this?

Response

95% of correspondence is about operations and is dealt with through the Shire administration.

Question 3:

The prosecution notice issued to Simon Saint in August 2009, for unapproved advertisement was based on the written law Section 218(a) of the Planning and Development Act 2005. This Act was amended from 1st July, 2009. Could the Shire representatives please explain why they did not issue a warning letter followed by an infringement notice under Division 3 Part 13 of the Act for a minor breach, as opposed to the litigious decision to go directly to prosecution in court?

(An excuse may be that the Shire had previously corresponded regarding signage however, correspondence for any previous issues related to contravention of the Town Planning Scheme No 2. As this prosecution notice referred to contravention of the written law of the Planning and Development Act 2005 and in the interest of 'procedural fairness', the issue of pre-warning correspondence, followed by issue of an infringement notice for a minor breach to avoid prosecution in Court is quoted in this Act).

Question 1:

Do the Council consider ratepayers should receive a reply when writing to the York administration?

Why has a letter written to Council, attention Mr Gordon Tester and hand delivered by myself on the 19th April, not been responded to? After 6 weeks, on the 1st July I sent a copy of that letter via email to Council and as at 19th July now 3 months later I still have no reply from Council. Prior to my letter I had visited Council and spoke personally with Mr Tester re my concerns and he asked that I put it in writing to him and he would deal with it. Why has there been no response to my letter?

Response

The Environmental Health and Planning Officer responded to the correspondence within days by means of a site visit and a meeting with landowners.

Question 2:

On the 31st March Council sent letters to neighbours which is a strictly zoned residential area, on a proposed installation of a cold storage facility with submissions to be in by 23rd April and yet this cold storage facility was already installed before the submission date expired. Councillors, I hand delivered to Council, letters to all of you and you ask me to vote for you but do not have the courtesy to respond to my letter? Why had this been approved in a residential area?

Response

Councillors received your correspondence and dealt with it in the way they saw fit when dealing with the application.

Question 3:

In July 2009 my house was flooded due to water flow from heavy rain that came from a house in Cardwell Street. It went into my leach drain and then my sewerage tank and into my home. Peter Stevens advised me they had moved in before plumbing was properly in place. This has caused a serious health problem for me. On the 21st August I made a formal complaint to the CEO with photos, etc. The carpet in my house had to be pulled up. On 23rd September I sent another letter to the CEO, no reply to my e-mails or phone calls him or Peter Stevens. In October I contacted Councillor Walters who was very sympathetic and helpful by making a call to the CEO and on 28th October I received an email stating the problem was being rectified but no telephone call was ever made to me. Why considering this serious issue was there never a communication or reply to me?

Since the Council moved our monthly market to the Peace Park – have we not completed and complied with all Council requests?

Response No. Documentation was not provided – Insurance.

Question 2:

Since loosing the World Vision name and after a meeting between myself, Pat and Ray it was suggested we incorporate under our own right. Again we complied, by issuing receipts, publishing our fundraising results, forming a committee and advertising our intention to incorporate. Did we not?

Response

No you did not – issues with insurance and who was incorporated.

Question 3:

Why then after nearly 20 years of running a successful market and acting responsibly, over 3 separate venues, do we now have to lodge a \$500 Bond. It is the same group of people, we are not the 'new kid on the block'. Without any prior notice, this amount is a huge problem to overcome at this time as we are paying out \$200 approximately for incorporation and in 2 months times \$500 again for Insurance and we have by posting off all the fundraising for June to World Vision as a matter of principal, now have to start our finances from scratch.

Response

The \$500 bond is part of the responsibility of holding markets.

A meeting can be held to answer all Mrs Dols questions as they do not need to be discussed at a Council meeting.

Summary:

Four quotations have been obtained from local plumbing contractors to decommission the onsite waste water disposal unit currently serving the Pioneer Lodge situated at 50 Macartney Street York and to connect the Pioneer Lodge and Units to sewer.

The lowest quote of \$12,340 (GST Inclusive) is recommended to be included in the 2010/ 2011 Council Budget.

Background:

In November 2009 the Water Corporation extended the sewer at Councils request terminating at the corner of 50 Macartney Street.

The purpose of the sewer extension was to facilitate the decommissioning of the onsite waste water disposal units serving both the Pioneer Lodge and associated units situated on this site, and to then connect the buildings to the sewer.

In Mid June 2010 four quotations were obtained from local plumbing contractors to decommission the onsite waste water disposal unit serving the Pioneer Lodge and to connect the Pioneer Lodge and associated accommodation units to sewer.

The decommissioning of the Aerobic Treatment Unit serving the accommodation units was not part of the quote as the removal of this unit will be undertaken as a separate issue.

Financial Implications:

A summary of the quotes received for the sewer is outlined below.

Contractor 1 - \$26,222.00 Contractor 2 - \$22,528.00 Contractor 3 - \$16,384.50 Contractor 4 - \$12,430.00

All quotes are GST inclusive.

Strategic Implications:

The connection of the Pioneer Lodge and associated accommodation units to sewer will enhance public health by removing the possibility of failure of the onsite waste water disposal units.

Site Inspection: Site Inspection Undertaken: Not applicable

Triple bottom Line Assessment: Economic Implications:

As there is some time between Councils 2010/2011 budget being adopted and the date of the submission of the quotes an allowance of approximately six percent should be included to cover the rising cost of materials in the new financial year.

Social Implications:

Some minor inconvenience to accessing units will occur when the sewer drain line is installed across driveways fronting Macartney Street.

Residents will be advised well in advance to minimise inconvenience.

Environmental Implications:

Connection to sewer will reduce effluent overflow which has been an issue in the past. Connection of additional units may also increase treated water available for use for community benefit.

Comment:

All contractors were quoting on Councils written requirements and visited the site prior to submitting their quotes.

It is recommended that Council engage Contractor 4 with an allowance of six percent for increase in material costs.

Summary:

The Rotary Club of Canning Bridge has provided a proposal for Councils consideration being the York Market Proposal – "Taste of the Wheat belt".

The objectives are to provide a casual platform for the local community to promote local and regional products and produce while enhancing a community spirit.

It is also hoped to be able to develop a market place atmosphere where both locals and visitors to the region can enjoy this type of market experience.

It is proposed to conduct the markets in Avon Park on the 2nd Saturday of the month between the hours of 9am – 2pm.

Background:

A comprehensive proposal for the establishment of the York Rotary Markets was received on 25 June from the Rotary Club of Canning Bridge outlining roles and responsibilities and indicating that a Local Community member would be liasing directly with the Shire about this proposal.

The markets will be open to stall holders from the local and surrounding areas to sell goods that will include a variety of items from coffee, food items either cooked or fresh produce to craft, arts and flowers. The markets main focus will be on produce from local and surrounding wheat belt producers.

It is envisaged that the only obligations on Council are to maintain the park toilet block in a clean condition with enough consumables for the day and that Council would provide and maintain enough rubbish/ recycle bins for the day.

At least one rotary club member will be onsite during the day to ensure all required permits are in place.

Financial Implications:

While Rotary is a recognised community group and not subject to fees for the use of Avon Park, the stall holders however will generally be commercial entities that will be subject to stall holder applications and fees.

The applicants have indicated that they will manage this process.

Strategic Implications:

It is considered that having these markets would enhance the tourism experience of visitors to York.

Triple bottom Line Assessment: Economic Implications:

Possible damage to Avon Park by stall holder's vehicles needs to be considered; however the rules Rotary has in place do not allow stall holders vehicles to be remaining on the Park after 8.50 am and may only return after the markets have finished at 2.05pm.

Social Implications:

Community markets are an excellent place for social interaction and are to be encouraged

Environmental Implications:

The rubbish produced from the food stalls and oil dropped from stall holder's vehicles requires careful management.

Comment:

A community based local produce market is to be encouraged as promoting wheat belt produce is a unique concept that will enhance tourism in the area.

Issues in regards to possible vehicle damage to reticulated sprinklers in the park require further assessment and even the imposition of a bond to cover such matters should be considered.

Summary:

The York Friendship Club seeks Council permission to conduct a market on the second Saturday of each month at Peace Park to replace the former World Vision Markets.

Background:

Following the conclusion of the World Vision Markets in June 2010, a recently formed community group known as the York Friendship Club has indicated a desire that they wish to continue the market for charitable purposes.

The York Friendship Club has commenced the process to become an incorporated body with a determination of whether or not the application is to be approved likely to be made in August 2010.

Public liability Insurance has been obtained for the proposed incorporated body that expires on 1 September 2010.

On 8 July 2010 an application was received from the York Friendship Club requesting that Council recognise the York Friendship Club as a genuine community group to qualify for reduced fees for hire or use of Shire facilities and to continue with the Community Markets at Peace Park.

The markets at Peace Park are currently being run temporarily by the York Young Men's Group as an interim measure pending a formal application from the York Friendship Group to Council and incorporation of this group.

Background:

The current principal Local Law relating to the York Public Cemetery was first adopted by Council on 15 November 1999, and gazetted on 22 February 2000.

To comply with the provisions of section 3.16 of the *Local Government Act* 1995, the Shire of York commenced a review of its local laws on 15 October 2009.

At the conclusion of the review process it was identified that a series of amendments were required to the principal local law.

The purpose of this report is to allow:

- (1) the Presiding Person to give notice to the meeting of the intent to make a new Cemeteries Amendment local law;
- (2) the Presiding Person to give notice of the purpose and effect of the proposed Cemeteries Amendment local law,
- (3) for the Council to adopt the proposed amendment local law, and
- (4) to allow for advertising of the amendment local law for public comment.

Consultation:

As required by section 3.12 the Local Government Act 1995, an advertisement is to be placed, in a state-wide newspaper, inviting the public to comment on the proposed local law, with submissions being open for a period of not less than 6 weeks (42 days).

The advertisement will be placed once Council has resolved its intent to make the local law.

In addition, copies of the proposed Local Law, as amended, (gazettal copy), and the National Competition Policy review must be sent to the relevant Minister for comment.

Statutory Environment:

Local Government Act 1995

Section 3.16 of the Act requires the Council to carry out a formal review of its Local Laws every 8 years. The Act provides that after the last day for submissions the Council is to consider any submissions received and cause a report of the review to be prepared and considered by the Council. The Council must adopt the report on the review at which time it determines whether the Local Laws should be repealed or amended.

Cemeteries Act 1986

CEMETERIES AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2010

Under the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1986* and the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of York resolved on the [insert adoption resolution date here], to make the following local law.

1. Citation

This local law is cited as the Shire of York Cemeteries Amendment Local Law 2010.

2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation fourteen days after the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Principal Local Law

In this Local Law, the *Shire of York Local Law relating to the York Public Cemetery* published in the *Government Gazette* on 22 February 2000 is referred to as the principal Local Law. The principal Local Law is amended as follows –

4. Preliminary

In construing the following modifications, where a modification requires the renumbering of a clause, subclause or paragraph, subsequent modifications have been drafted on the basis that the renumbering has been effected;

5. Arrangement amended

The arrangement is amended as follows -

- (1) Insert, immediately after item "1.3", the following text "1.4 Content and Intent";
- (2) Insert, immediately before item "3.1", the following text "3.1 Grant Right of Burial" and renumber item "3.1" to "3.2";
- (3) Delete item "3.2 Application for cremation".
- (4) Insert, immediately after item 3.5, the following text "3.6 Timer for Burials";
- (5) Amend item 4.2 by deleting the words "Single Funeral Permits" and substituting "Application for a Single Funeral Permit".
- (6) Amend item 4.3 by deleting the word "Refusal" and substituting the words "may be refused".
- (7) Delete item "5.3";
- (8) Renumber items "5.4" to 5.6, inclusive, to "5.3" to "5.5", respectively;
- (9) Renumber item "5.12" to item "5.6".
- (10) Delete item "6.2" and substitute the text "6.2 Re-opening a Grave";

 - (b) "6.4 Opening of a Coffin";
- (12) Insert, immediately before item "7.11", the following text "7.11 Minor Maintenance and Repair Works";
- (13) Renumber items "7.11" to "7.12" inclusive to "7.12" to" 7.13" respectively;
- (14) Delete in its entirety "Division 2 Lawn Section" and renumber the existing "Division 3" to "Division 2";
- (15) Renumber "Division 4" to "Division 3".
- (16) Renumber items "7.15" to "7.20" inclusive to "7.14" to "7.19" respectively;

- (17) Insert in item 8.1, after the word "Animals", the words "and Guide Dogs";
- (18) Delete item 8.2;
- (19) Renumber items "8.3" to "8.8" inclusive to "8.2" to "8.7" respectively;
- (20) In renumbered item 8.3 delete the word "withered";
- (21) Insert, immediately after renumbered item 8.7, a new item as follows "8.8 Fireworks or Firearms".

6. Part 1 Clause 1.2 amended

(1) Subclause (1) is amended as follows -

(a) insert, in the appropriate alphabetical order, the following definitions -

""Act" means the Cemeteries Act 1986;

"animal" means any animal;

"burial" has the same meaning as is given to it in the Act;

"Cemetery" means the Shire of York Cemeteries, which the Governor, by order, has placed under the care control and management of the Board;

"dead body" has the same meaning given to it in the Act;

"funeral" includes the burial of a dead body and all associated processions and ceremonials but does not include so much of the ceremonial that is solely a religious rite;

"grant" means a grant issued by the Board, of an exclusive right of burial in a grave;

"grave" means a specified area of the cemetery for burial;

"guide dog" has the same meaning as is given to that expression in the Dog Act 1976;

"holder" in relation to a grant includes-

(a) a person issued with a grant by the Board;

(b)a person for the time being appearing to the Board to be the holder of a grant;

"local government" means the Shire of York;

"Memorial" means a memorial plaque or memorial as described in this local law or as otherwise approved by the Board;

"Minister" means the Minister for Local Government;

"remains" means ashes or what remains of a dead body after burial;";

- (b) the definition "CEO" is amended by inserting, after the word "Board", the words "and includes an acting Chief Executive Officer;"
- (c) delete the definition "mausoleum";
- (d) delete the definition "vault";

(2) Insert new subclauses (2) and (3) as follows -

- "(2) Unless otherwise defined herein the terms and expressions used in this local law shall have the same meaning given to them in the Act;
- (3) Where a term is not defined in this local law, the Act or Regulations, the term is to be taken from the Oxford Dictionary.".

6. Part 1 Clause 1.3 deleted

Clause 1.3 is deleted and the following is substituted -

"1.3 Repeal of Local Law

The Shire of York Bylaws Relating to York Public Cemetery as published in the Government Gazette of 7 June 1935, as amended, are repealed.".

7. Part 1 New Clause 1.4

Insert, after clause 1.3, a new Clause 1.4 as follows -

"1.4 Content and Intent

This local law provides for rules and guidelines for the management and control of cemeteries located in York (Reserve No. 20628).".

8. Part 3 New Clause 3.1

(1) Insert, after the Title "PART 3 APPLICATION FOR FUNERALS", a new clause 3.1 as follows -

"3.1 Grant of right of burial

The Board may issue to a person a grant of right of burial, for the term specified in the Act from time to time, upon –

- (a) written application by that person; and
- (b) payment of the set fee.".

9. Part 3 Clause 3.2 deleted

(1) Delete Clause 3.2.

(2) Renumber clauses "3.1" to "3.4" inclusive to "3.2" to "3.5" respectively.

(3) In renumbered clause 3.3 -

- (a) Delete the numbers "3.1" and substitute "3.2"; and
- (b) Delete the numbers "3.3" and substitute "3.4".

10.Part 3 New Clause 3.6

Insert, in the appropriate numerical order, a new clause 3.6 as follows -

"3.6 Time for burials

- (1) A person shall only carry out a burial between the hours of 6:00am and 6:00pm Monday to Sunday.
- (2) A person shall not carry out a burial -
 - (a) on Christmas Day; or
 - (b) on Good Friday.".

11. Part 4 Clause 4.2 amended

Delete the heading of clause 4.2 and substitute the following 'Application for a Single Funeral Permit".

12. Part 5 Clause 5.3 deleted

(1) Delete clause 5.3.

(1) Subject to subclause (2), if for the purpose of re-opening a grave in the cemetery, the Board finds it necessary to remove plants, grass, shrubs or other like matter from the grave, then the person ordering the re-opening of that grave shall bear the cost of the removal and any necessary reinstatement.

(2) If the Minister orders the exhumation of a body in accordance with section 58 of the Act, then the Minister may further order how and by whom the cost referred to in subclause (1) should be met.

6.3 Exhumation of a Coffin

- (1) Subject to subclause (2), a person shall not exhume a coffin in the cemetery for the purposes of re-burial within twelve (12) months after the date of its interment.
- (2) Subclause (1) shall not apply where the exhumation is ordered or authorised pursuant to the Act.
- (3) Subject to subclause (1) and (2) prior to any other exhumation, the holder of a grant must have applied in writing to the Board requesting the exhumation and the Board has authorised the exhumation.

6.4 Opening of Coffin

- (1) A person shall not open a coffin in the cemetery unless
 - (a) the coffin is opened for the purposes of the exhumation of a dead body; or
 - (b) that person has produced to the Board an order signed by the Commission of Police and the Board has approved the opening of that coffin.".

16.Part 7 Clause 7.2 amended

Insert, after the word "foundations", the words "in accordance with the Board's specifications".

All projects undertaken will need to comply with any environmental requirements.

Comment:

The Royalties for Regions programme has a strong emphasis on asset management and preservation in addition to infrastructure provisions to improve the lifestyle of rural residents.

The Objectives of the Royalties for Regions is a plan for the whole of Western Australia, with a focus on building communities in regional areas through six policy objectives:

- Building capacity in regional communities
- Retaining benefits in regional communities
- Improving services to regional communities
- Attaining sustainability
- Expanding opportunity
- Growing prosperity

The Guidelines are specific in what cannot be funded from Royalties for Regions.

There is a high degree of accountability and compliance associated with the funding including a half yearly payment and reporting system.

The Shire of York like most local governments has a Plan for the Future which has already identified infrastructure and asset preservation needs and this should be the basis for any allocations. This will be further developed with the Forward Capital Works Plan, which is to be prepared by Dominic Carbone.

Where ever possible the funds should be leveraged with other grants to fully utilise existing financial opportunities and to achieve as many viable and sustainable projects possible to benefit the community in both the short and long term.

All projects considered should be assessed on whole of life costs in addition to the initial construction or development costs as operating or replacement costs can negate the initial value and benefit.

Before receiving any 2010/11 funds local governments must acquit their initial application from 2008/09 and provide RDL with an acceptable Forward Capital Works Plan, which is being funded through the 2009/10 allocation.

COUNTRY LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND 2010-11

I am pleased to inform you that the 2010-11 Country Local Government Fund (CLGF) guidelines and allocations have now been finalised.

With the passage of the *Royalties for Regions Act 2009* there is now greater certainty in the total amount allocated to the Royalties for Regions fund. It is unlikely that a significant deferral of CLGF funds will occur during 2010-11.

The 2010-11 budget estimates show that the proportion of the total CLGF amount allocated to local governments for the years 2011-12 and 2012-13 is 50% for individual allocations and 50% for regional groups of country local governments. In the 2013-14 year, the CLGF for local governments is 100% allocated to regional groups of country local governments. Local governments are reminded that figures in the State Budget for the out years are estimates and confirmation of funding amounts will be made following the handing down of each State budget. Councils should be mindful of the projected changes in proportional allocations when preparing forward capital works plans.

2010-11 CLGF Guidelines

Cabinet has approved the 2010-11 CLGF guidelines. The new guidelines are considerably more flexible than those for 2008-09, partly in response to feedback from individual local governments, the Western Australian Local Government Association and the Regional Development Commissions (RDCs). For example, a broader definition of capital works has been adopted, payment of staff is allowed in some circumstances, the annual allocation can be spent over a two year period and funds can be spent on community owned assets.

Copies of both the individual and regional group component guidelines are enclosed for your reference. These guidelines will support the preparation of forward capital works plans for individual local governments' and business cases for regional groups' projects.

Provision of a business case for each regional group project is a prerequisite to access the regional group allocations from the CLGF in 2010-11.

Country local governments are reminded not to expend any assumed CLGF funds until forward capital works plans / business plans and projects are approved by RDL, Financial Assistance Agreements have been jointly signed and monies have been received by the local government / legal entity.

In preparing forward capital works plans and business cases, local governments are also encouraged to accommodate any approvals timeframes that may be required to deliver CLGF projects including, for example, Native Title negotiations, Crown Land access, environmental approvals or heritage clearances. In relation to Crown Land access, country local governments should contact Lands division of the Department of Regional Development and Lands (RDL) on telephone 08 9347 5000.

Individual local government allocation

Under CLGF in 2010-11 the Shire of York will be allocated \$514 604 directly to utilise on projects identified in its forward capital works plan prepared with the 2009-10 CLGF allocation and approved by RDL. The forward capital works plan will demonstrate how it is linked to and consistent with developing and/or ongoing strategic and asset management plans and identify current and future funding sources, including but not limited to CLGF. The plan will need to include strategies to manage the risk regarding the unpredictability of future funding sources for infrastructure.

It is acknowledged that the strategic and asset management planning currently being undertaken and supported by the Department of Local Government will take place over a longer timeframe than the preparation of forward capital works plans. Therefore the initial forward capital works plan submitted to RDL may require further revision over time. It is expected that the plan will be reviewed annually and resubmitted each year as part of local governments' CLGF project(s) proposal. This annual revision will provide the opportunity to review the forward capital works plan in line with strategic, asset and financial management plans.

Regional groups of country local governments' allocation

The amount of \$277 094 will be available for the Shire of York to contribute towards the regional grouping of local governments that the Shire of York forms through the facilitated planning being conducted with the RDCs. The funding is to be pooled for the group as a whole, rather than expended by each local government according to the amount notionally allocated through the CLGF funding formula.

Local governments are reminded that regional group funding is for larger scale infrastructure projects that clearly demonstrate wider community benefits across their region (for example infrastructure developments that attract industry, such as upgrades to ports, roads, rail, communications, power).

Acknowledgement of CLGF

Local governments are required to acknowledge Royalties for Regions on their CLGF projects. A standard sign, designed in accordance with an RDL template, must be erected in a prominent position at the site of every project where the CLGF contribution is more than \$100 000. Signage for all 2008-09 projects fitting this criterion must also be erected.

2010-11 Guidelines

OBJECTIVES

Royalties for Regions is a plan for the whole of Western Australia, with a focus on building communities in regional areas through six policy objectives:

- building capacity in regional communities
- retaining benefits in regional communities
- improving services to regional communities
- attaining sustainability
- expanding opportunity
- growing prosperity.

The primary objective of the Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund (CLGF) is to address infrastructure backlogs across the country local government sector.

The Fund provides the country local government sector with additional money for the purpose of infrastructure provision and renewal. Funding in 2010-11 is provided to individual country local governments and regional groups of country local governments to promote strategic infrastructure development and asset preservation and renewal.

The Fund aims to:

- address infrastructure backlogs and support capacity building
- improve the financial sustainability of country local governments in WA through improved asset management
- provide financial assistance to country local governments which choose to amalgamate voluntarily
- assist groups of country local governments to fund larger scale infrastructure projects.

The Department of Regional Development and Lands (RDL) is administering the Fund.

The guidelines in this document relate to the provision of assistance to individual country local governments to address infrastructure backlogs.

WHAT CAN BE FUNDED

Expenditure of allocations must be on individual local government infrastructure asset renewal and/or infrastructure asset creation. The Fund is aimed at encouraging additional expenditure by the local government on planned infrastructure needs.

Projects must be identified in the forward capital works plans approved by RDL under the 2009-10 CLGF Guidelines.

It is expected that infrastructure projects funded through CLGF are construction ready. It is considered that for a construction ready project, local governments should have as a minimum completed initial planning through feasibility/business plans, have obtained realistic cost estimates for

the project by appropriate independent professionals such as engineers, quantity surveyors and architects, and be well advanced in obtaining all necessary approvals and licences.

CLGF monies must be used on the capital works component of the infrastructure project. Capital works are defined as building and engineering works that create an asset, as well as constructing or installing facilities and fixtures associated with, and forming an integral part of, those works (such as buildings, floor finishes, air conditioning and security systems, but excluding items such as furniture and office equipment). The definition encompasses the purchase of buildings. Headworks costs associated with an eligible capital works project are acceptable.

Country local governments on the SWIS grid meeting the cost of the Distribution Headworks Charge may also be eligible for a total subsidy from Western Power if located at remote or edge of grid locations. For further details contact Western Power on 13 10 87 or refer to the website http://westernpower.com.au. Country local governments should check the availability of this subsidy prior to costing headworks charges into a CLGF funded project.

Individual country local governments may expend CLGF funds on assets which are not under the direct care or control of a local government where all of the following must be met:

- the project and the supporting information is included in the local government's forward capital works plan
- it can be demonstrated that there is a clear commitment to the asset being accessible on a long term basis to the broader community
- there is a plan for the future maintenance of the asset
- the local government maintains appropriate control over ensuring that the asset is used for the benefit of the community (for example, through a formal written agreement with a third party).

Capital renewal is an acceptable expenditure. Capital renewal is expenditure on items which are deemed to extend the life of an asset and sustain the service of an asset at the same level on a like-for-like basis. Examples of renewal projects include major restorations, or renovations, such as repainting and major roof and floor repairs.

Other Infrastructure Related Costs

An amount not exceeding 15% of a local government's CLGF allocation for a particular project may be spent on project documentation activities (such as architectural, structural, mechanical and hydraulic engineering plans) and construction and project management fees.

While it is expected that local governments will contribute towards CLGF supported projects through areas such as staff, the cost of reasonable direct wages, where they are a component in the construction of an infrastructure asset may be included under CLGF expenditure. Please refer to Section 9, Pages 40-41, of the *Local Government Accounting Manual (Edition 1)* for the relevant treatment of employee benefits in relation to CLGF.

Local governments need to be aware that in determining Commonwealth Financial Assistance Grants, the Local Government Grants Commission is likely to take into account CLGF funds to the extent to which local governments spend them on road asset preservation and renewal. Where the funding to local governments is spent on bridges, buildings and infrastructure assets other than road asset preservation, this may not affect financial assistance allocations. Based on 2008-09 CLGF spending, however, it is likely that only minor impacts will occur on financial assistance allocations.

Please contact the Department of Local Government should you require information regarding the Commission's definition of road preservation.

WHAT CANNOT BE FUNDED

CLGF funds cannot be applied to expenditure on non-infrastructure items. The funds are not to be used for:

 projects not identified as priorities in the local government's approved forward capital works plan referred to above

- purchasing equipment (e.g. furniture, computers, vehicles and moveable plant)
- purchasing land
- retiring debt
- engaging consultants or staff outside or beyond the timeframe of a CLGF funded infrastructure project
- general maintenance*
- feasibility studies, cost-benefit analysis, impact studies, marketing plans, research projects, stand alone project designs or plans
- investment for the sole purpose of return (e.g. interest)
- retrospective funding, where projects have been completed or have commenced construction prior to receiving approval from RDL.

*General maintenance is recurrent expenditure which is considered as the day-to-day servicing of an asset including small parts. Please refer to Section 9, Page 10, of the Local Government Accounting Manual (Edition 1) for the relevant definition.

HOW TO APPLY

Before receiving the first instalment of 2010-11 funds, recipients are required to fully acquit their 2008-09 allocation, complete a forward capital works plan to the satisfaction of RDL and enter into a Financial Assistance Agreement, Please refer to the 2009-10 CLGF guidelines for further details regarding the acquittal requirements.

The process for CLGF grant recipients will be:

- 1. Complete a forward capital works plan to the satisfaction of RDL.
- Complete a proposal form outlining projects to be funded. Projects must be identified in the approved forward capital works plan submitted by a country local government and approved by RDL. The proposal must include a pro-forma budget for each project to be funded.
- 3. Upon approval of projects, RDL will forward applicants a Financial Assistance Agreement, which will outline the conditions of the funding. Applicants are to complete this document where required and to sign and return a hard copy to RDL.
- 4. The Agreement will then be signed by the Director General of RDL and the grant payment will be processed.

It is important to note that:

- Before receiving any 2010-11 funds local governments must acquit their initial allocation from 2008-09 and provide RDL with an acceptable forward capital works plan, which is being funded through the 2009-10 CLGF allocation.
- Payment of the 2010-11 funds is likely to be in one instalment.
- The 2010-11 funds will be spent in accordance with the RDL approved forward capital works plan prepared by each local government.
- The preference is for the funds to be spent in the year in which they are paid to a local government. However if there are delays in expenditure, and subject to reasonable progress being made to the satisfaction of RDL, local governments will be given up to two years from the date of payment of these funds to acquit them.
- Local governments will be expected to review their forward capital works plan each year. These revised plans must be approved by RDL. Subject to this approval and to reasonable progress being made with the expenditure of the 2010-11 CLGF grant to the satisfaction of RDL, payment of the 2011-12 funds is likely to occur early in the financial year in which it is due. Local governments will be given up to two years from the date of payment of these funds to spend and acquit them to the satisfaction of RDL.
- This process would then continue into the out years although it should be noted that the intention is to provide a greater percentage of CLGF funds to regional groups of country local governments over time.

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CONDITIONS AND OBLIGATIONS

Local governments will be required to seek RDL's approval, in writing, should they wish to reallocate CLGF 2010-11 funding. Project changes requested must adhere to these guidelines and be granted approval by RDL before proceeding.

For all projects, or aspects of projects, that appear to fall outside the guidelines, country local governments should contact RDL to discuss these circumstances and how they may be managed.

Applicants need to be aware that RDL may consult with other agencies and relevant stakeholders in relation to proposed projects.

Recipients need to be aware that RDL may undertake sample audits to assess the application of the funds. Any monies not spent for the purpose for which they were provided must be refunded to RDL. The Office of the Auditor General may also undertake sample audits.

Local governments are reminded that, in addition to the accountability provisions stated above, they operate under an accountability regime prescribed by the *Local Government Act 1995*. Under this regime each local government^{*} is accountable to its community, reporting through annual budgets, financial statements and annual reports, and faces public scrutiny by the public, ratepayers and electors through open council meetings, annual electors' meetings and the ballot box at biennial elections.

All activities and expenditure undertaken by the local governments in relation to the CLGF project(s) must be in accordance with the *Local Government Act* 1995 and the *Local Government (Functions & General) Regulations* 1996. The provision of the goods and services must be in accordance with the purchasing and regional price preference policies (*Part 4 of the Local Government (Functions & General) Regulations* 1996) of the relevant local government.

CLGF 2008-09 Acquittals

Completion of final acquittal reports for the 2008-09 CLGF monies is required to access the 2010-11 funding. CLGF Final Acquittal Report Forms are available from RDL's website: http://www.royaltiesforregions.wa.gov.au

Please refer to the 2008-09 guidelines for further details regarding the acquittal requirements.

CLGF 2009-10 Acquittals

Please refer to the 2009-10 guidelines for further details regarding the acquittal requirements.

2010-11 Reporting Requirements

All country local governments will be required to enter into a Financial Assistance Agreement with RDL before receiving payments in 2010-11.

Recipients are required to report to RDL on a quarterly basis, as outlined in the Financial Assistance Agreement. Annual audits will be required until the funding has been fully acquitted. Project progress updates may be requested by RDL at other times. The local government is required to respond with this information within the timeframe requested.

A Final Acquittal Report Form, including an audited Statement of Income and Expenditure for the 2010-11 allocation, is to be submitted to RDL upon expenditure of the *entire* allocation against the set guidelines. Recipients are to submit this report as described in their Financial Assistance Agreement. Further documentation regarding this final report will be made available through RDL's website <u>http://www.royaltiesforregions.wa.gov.au</u>.

Any income accrued on CLGF allocations from a reserve fund (or similar) must be declared in the Final Report referred to above and such income must be spent in accordance with these Guidelines.

Funding payments for 2012-13 may not be processed until the 2010-11 reports have been received by the RDL and confirmed as satisfactory. Should recipients not adhere to these conditions they may be excluded from future years distributions of the Fund and their notional entitlement may be distributed to other recipients.

Acknowledgment of CLGF

Community awareness of the facilities funded by the CLGF will assist in the program's acceptance, success and longevity. It is therefore important that local governments acknowledge their Royalties for Region's CLGF allocation in all communication activities. Examples are provided below.

- Newsletter articles, advertising, speeches, presentations or other publications by displaying the Royalties for Regions logo and the State Government logo and acknowledging the funding assistance.
- Signage on the project site. Projects receiving over \$100 000 should display a sign/plaque acknowledging Royalties for Regions funding during work and after the project is completed. If the project is set in stages or across a number of locations, one sign should be placed at an appropriate site in an area of high visibility. Signage for projects funded for less than \$100 000 is optional. The 2010-11 CLGF allocation may be used to purchase and install the sign/plaque.
- Public announcements (media statements), official launches and/or openings. To ensure consistency of messages delivered across government agencies and departments, local governments should work with and seek RDL approval on all public announcements.

TAX INFORMATION

The Department of Regional Development and Lands is registered for GST and has been issued with Australian Business Number (ABN) 28 807 221 246. RDL regards financial assistance under the CLGF as payment for a supply. GST-registered financial assistance recipients will therefore be liable for GST in connection with the financial assistance.

For GST-registered financial assistance recipients, RDL will increase the financial assistance by the amount of GST payable. GST-registered financial assistance recipients must provide the Office of Shared Services (OSS) with a tax invoice for the GST inclusive value of the financial assistance unless RDL and the recipient have agreed in writing to the issue of a Recipient Created Tax Invoice.

Payment will not be made until the recipient is registered as a supplier with OSS and OSS receive a tax invoice or an agreement to issue a Recipient Created Tax Invoice. The recipient acknowledges that the financial assistance provided is consideration for a supply to RDL and that the GST component will be included in the applicant's next Business Activity Statement lodged with the Australian Taxation Office.

For applicants not registered for GST, RDL will *not* include GST. Nor will it reimburse an unregistered financial assistance recipient for GST paid or payable to a third party. Unregistered financial assistance recipients must provide OSS with an invoice for the amount of the grant.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

Recipients are informed that RDL is subject to the WA Freedom of Information Act, which provides a general right of access to records held by State Government agencies and local government authorities.

Recipients should also be aware that information pertaining to the receipt of State Government financial assistance will be tabled in the Western Australian Parliament. This information could include

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the names of local governments, the amount of the assistance, the name of the project/activity and, possibly, a brief description thereof. This could result in requests for more detail to be released publicly.

PAYMENT DETAILS

Allocations are expected to be provided in one instalment. All payments are contingent upon receipt of required reporting and audit actions as outlined under **Conditions and Obligations**, above.

Method of Payment

The Department of Regional Development and Lands is responsible for the administration of this Fund. Please be aware that RDL operates under a Whole of Government shared corporate services environment. Through this arrangement, payments will be undertaken by OSS, a business unit of the Department of Treasury and Finance.

Upon receipt of the required documentation, RDL will raise a requisition and will issue recipients with a purchase order. Tax invoices for these funds will then need to be submitted directly to OSS, quoting the purchase order number and GST, if registered. The payment of this grant will be made direct to you from OSS, and not from RDL, within 30 days of receipt of invoice.
