Dear Rural Road Group Members

I met with Jen Green the Environmental Officer for the Shire on Friday 6th June to be briefed on the approval process for verge pruning and clearing.

The first of the attached documents outlines the roadside pruning that is permitted. The majority of the pruning that we discussed at the recent Road Group Meeting is within the allowable pruning zone so permits and prior approval are NOT required.

The second and third documents identify areas that are of significance and pruning or clearing in these areas will require permits.

I found Jen Green to be very approachable and helpful. I'm sure that we can all work together to formulate a workable verge pruning/clearing program that ensures the roads are safe and retains our native flora in a sustainable manner.

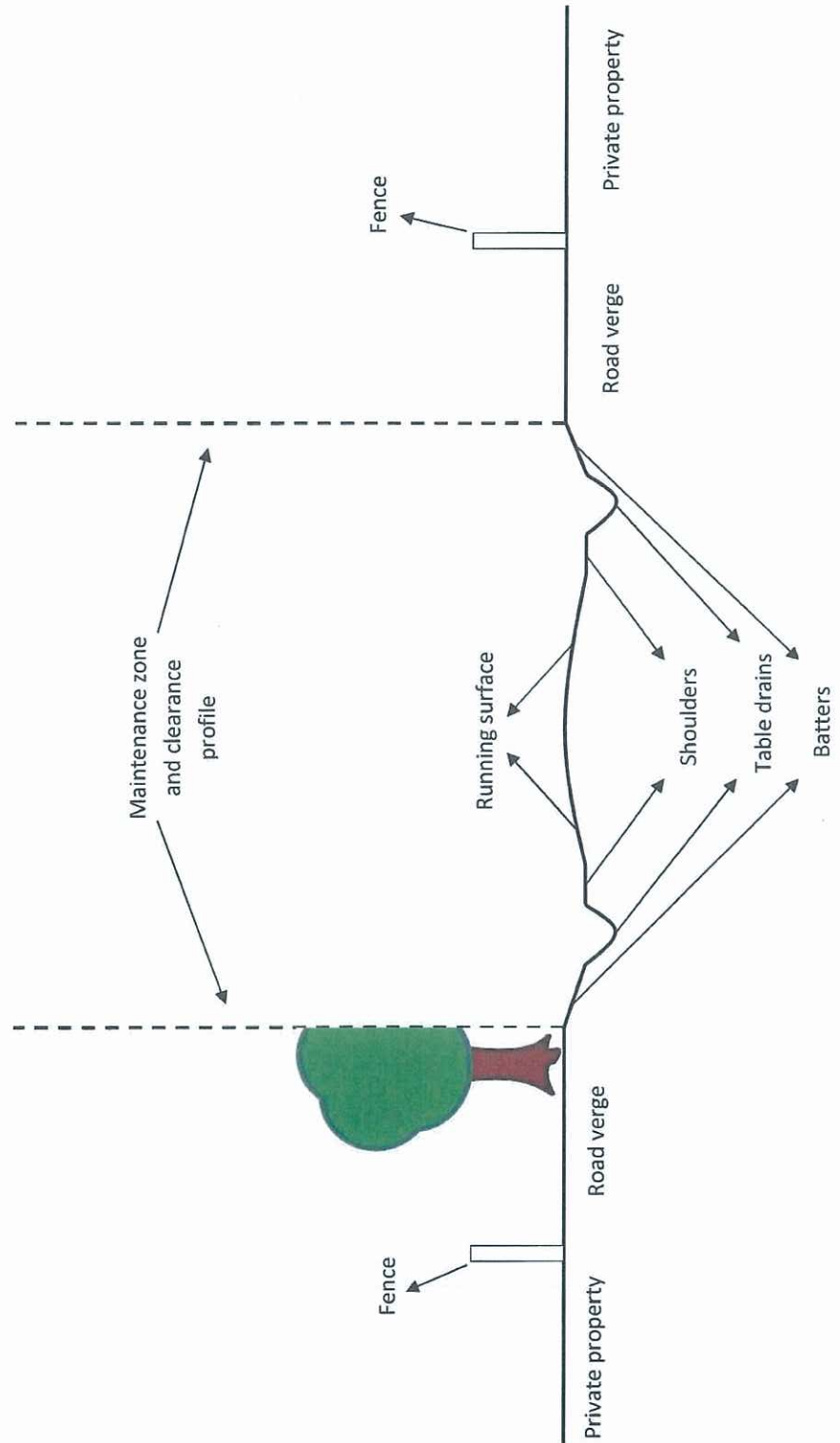
Graham Lantzke and I met with the local Wild Flower groups earlier in the year. The group are happy to work with Graham to identify sensitive and/or significant areas of road verge so that these can be identified and retained.

The planning of our verge pruning/clearing program will also need to take into account the routes of the Self Drive Tours within the shire. These can be downloaded from the shire website for those that are not familiar with them.

We can discuss this further at the meeting scheduled for the 19th of June.

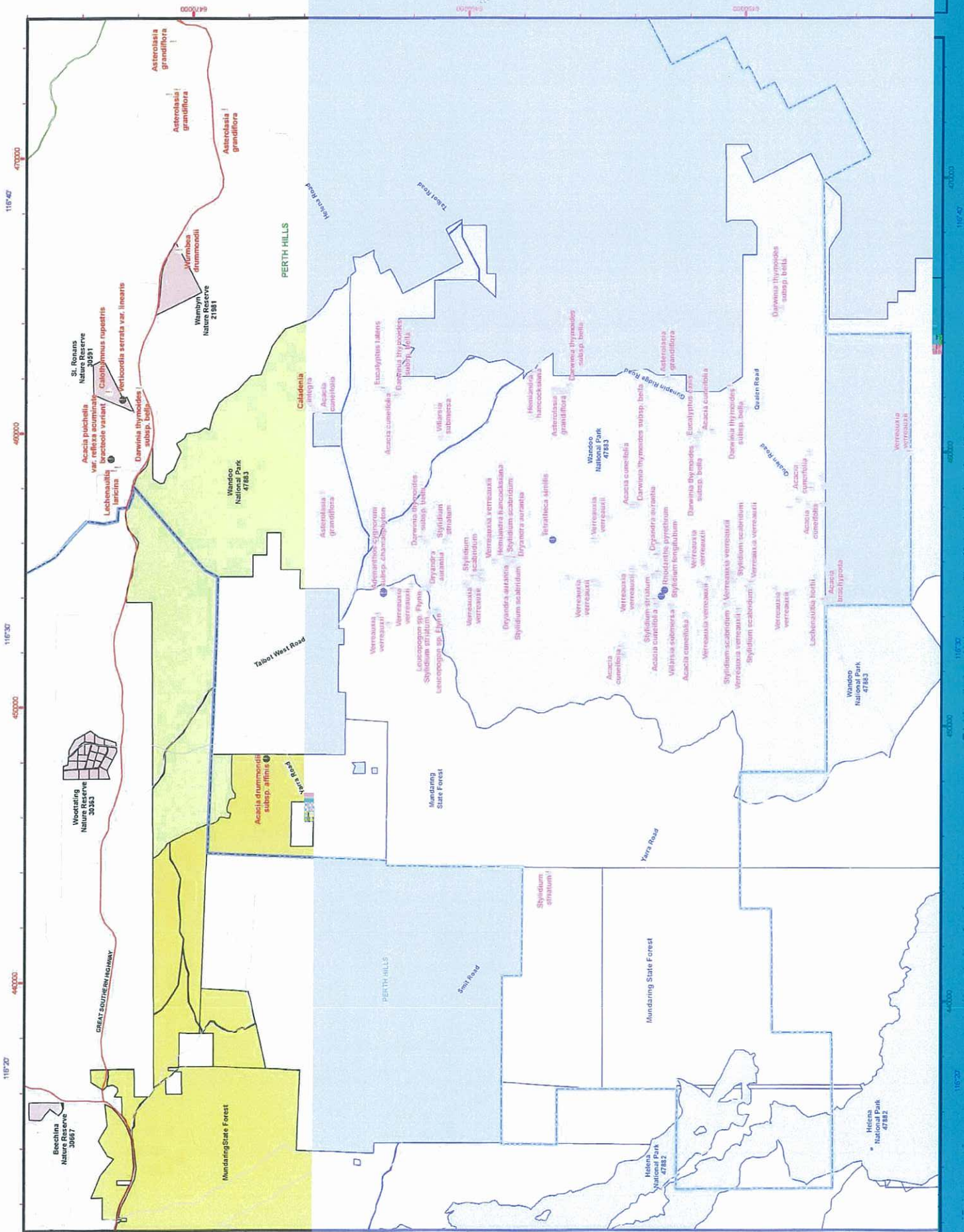
