**PART A**

It is proposed that there is a complete refurbishment of the York War Memorial located on the Shire Reserve on the corner of South and Railway Streets, York. This refurbishment is required following research conducted by Dr Michael Galvin which has determined that a significant number of servicemen's names are not included on the Memorial. Dr Galvin has provided evidence of more than 40 names should be added to the current list of names of servicemen and women on the Memorial.

Allied with the refurbishment of the Memorial it would be intended to upgrade the surroundings of the Memorial to reflect the prominence in which it is held.

**PART B**

That the original Krupp Gun, the property of the York RSL be properly housed within the confines of the York RSL Club in Avon Terrace York. It would be the intention of the RSL to seek additional funding to "house" this replica in a weather proof environment to protect the restored weapon.

This project will honour the significant contributions made to the WW1 efforts by men who were born in or lived in York, exemplified by the feat of greatest valour carried out by York Soldier Lt Lawrence Dominic McCarthy VC.

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**ANZAC CENTENARY LOCAL GRANTS PROGRAM**  
**Proposal from the Shire of York & the RSL Club of York**  
**April 2014**

**Proposal: Part A and B**

The Shire of York and the York RSL Club would like to apply as joint applicants with a two part proposal.

**Part A:**

It is proposed that there is a complete refurbishment of the York War Memorial located on the Shire Reserve on the corner of South and Railway Streets in York. This refurbishment is required, as research by Dr Michael Galvin, has determined that a significant number of servicemen's names are not included on the Memorial. Dr Galvin has located that there are over 40 names to be added to the current list of names of servicemen & women on the Memorial. Allied with the refurbishment of the Memorial it would be intended to upgrade the surroundings of the Memorial to reflect the prominence in which it is held.

**Part B:**

That the original Krupp Gun, the property of the York RSL be properly housed within the confines of the York RSL Club in Avon Terrace York. It would be the intention of the RSL to seek additional funding to "house" this replica in a weather proof environment to protect the restored weapon

**Part C:**

**Locations:**

The York War Memorial, the corner of South and Railway Streets in York.  
York RSL Club, Avon Terrace, York and the York Town Hall

**Applicants:**

The Proposal is submitted under joint sponsorship. The applicants being; the Shire of York and the RSL Club of York

The Shire of York is located at Joaquina Street, York with the contact person being Shire President, Cr Matthew Reid, whilst the RSL Club of York is located at Avon Terrace, York with the contact person being Mr David Jones, President.

***Assessment Criteria 1:***

The level of support for the proposal from the local community, including local community's involvement in developing the proposal and the accessibility of proposed project and events to the local community.

The increase interest in the ANZAC Centenary has risen considerably in York since the RSL Club through the efforts of the members and in particular Dr Michael Galvin, were able to commemorate and celebrate the heroic achievements of York born Lt Lawrence

Dominic McCarthy VC. This VC winner was also recognized by the French military by being awarded two Croix de Guerre.

Public attendance at the past 8 Dawn Services and Town Services have risen with each year and allied to this is the growing numbers of children attending both events.

The RSL Club sponsorship an essay competition each year with the York District High School for the students plus the Head Boy and Girl from the School give speeches at the Town Service.

York also has a "special" additional Memorial that commemorates the "National Servicemen and women".

The adding of over 40 names to the Memorial will provide a significant number of families to have their relations acknowledged after this long period of time while the placement of the Krupp Gun will add significantly to the RSL Club.

### ***Assessment Criteria 2:***

The connection of the proposal to significant military anniversaries, enlistments and other First War World events and that have had an impact on the nation and/or the local community

The rail line from Perth to Albany in the 1910 – 1915 was a significant transport mode for military personnel travelling to Albany to join up with ships heading for the European war zones. Many persons from the Wheatbelt area would have used York as the town from where they headed to either Perth or Albany to enlist. The York War Memorial sits adjacent to the rail line.

Lt Lawrence McCarthy VC was born in the township of York.

War trophies captured by Australian Troops began to be distributed to states and, through state committees on to Australian towns between 1919 and 1922. The pieces were then handed over to local trustees with a view to being displayed for communities. One of the War Trophies allocated to York was a 77mm Krupp Gun seized by the 28<sup>th</sup> Battalion east of Villiers Bretonneux in France on 12 August 1918. The Krupp Gun is displayed at the York War Memorial as part of the ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day Commemorations.

### ***Assessment Criteria 3:***

The ability of the proposal to enable the local community to commemorate the centenary of the First World War.

Figures indicate that approximately 20% of the enlisted personnel from York gave their lives in the First War World. This is a high figure of causality in WA's first inland town and included names from many families still a central part of the York community. The adding of "missing" names will, as previously stated, bring a closure and recognition to those families who relations have not been previously been honoured

### ***Assessment Criteria 4:***

The capacity of the applicants to deliver and implement the proposal within the specified timeframe and budget, including an assessment of how developed and capable of the implementation the proposal is.

The Shire of York will be the lead applicant in providing the applying for the project, the planning of the works program, the implementation of the works program, the completion of the works program and the supervision and management of the financial requirements of the project.

The RSL Club of York will provide the "historical research component" of the project plus will seek further information from families and individuals in relation to the acknowledgement of the names on the refurbished Memorial.

Allied to this they will provide support in the placement and housing of the Krupp Gun within the Club premises for public display purposes

#### ***Assessment Criteria 5:***

The proposal provides value for money.

This proposed refurbishment of the York War Memorial and the Krupp Gun placement and housing provides an opportunity to link a number of proposals (completed and proposed) together.

The York RSL Club has already completed a commemorative Rose Garden for acknowledgement of servicemen and women in York. They have also named the Club building after Lt Lawrence McCarthy VC and have been strong supporters of this Refurbishment project plus adding support to a future upgrading of the Mt Brown Look-out area for the Dawn Services each year. This proposal will see a permanent flag pole, lighting, upgrading of viewing and seating arrangements.

There is also a proposal from a number of individuals for the construction of and placement of a permanent statue to LT Lawrence McCarthy VC outside the Historic Town Hall in York. This statue would be within 200 metres of the York War Memorial. Added to this the historical fact that York is the oldest inland town in WA (1831) plus the town has a well developed tourist base, the recognition of the community to the personnel who served their country will attract many more to visit, view and learn from the variety of developed acknowledgement of York's First World War citizens.

#### ***Assessment Criteria 6:***

The level of in-kind and/or financial support from other sources, including the applicant(s).

Additional financial assistance will be sought from State and National RSL organizations and Lotterywest WA.

From Criteria 5 there is an indication that the Shire of York will provide workforce to help cover both application and implementation of the project whilst the York RSL will support the project through accessing the relevant information needed through Dr M. Galvin.

The applicants are confident that upon receipt of news of a successful application there will be an even greater community take up of the project.

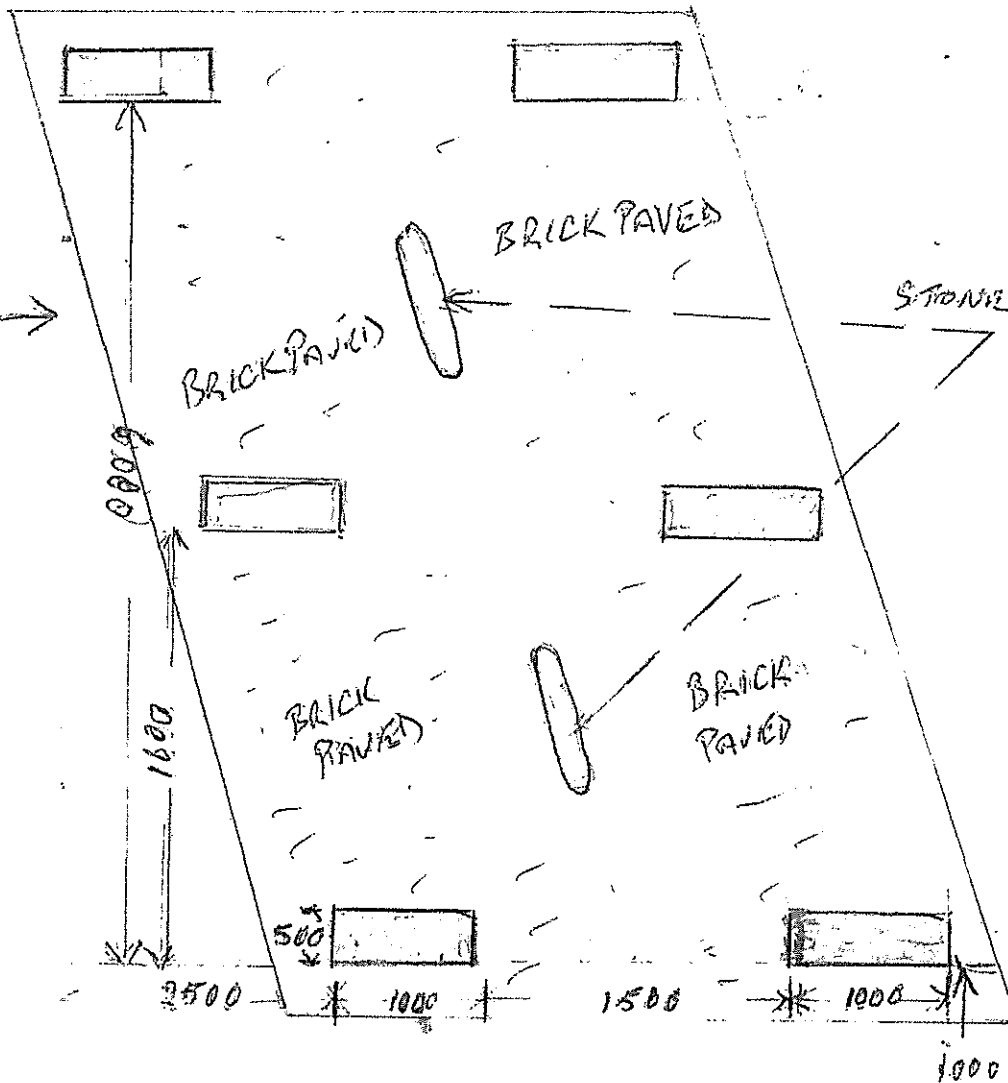
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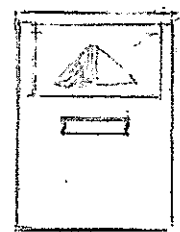

**Proposal: Part C – Lt L.D.McCarthy VC Sculpture and Plaque**

The project will honour the highly significant contributions made to the WW1 efforts by men who were born in or lived in York. This will be exemplified by the feat of greatest valour carried out by a York soldier, namely Lt Lawrence Dominic McCarthy VC who earned his Victoria Cross on 23 August 1918 at Madame Wood, France, by singlehandedly capturing five German Machine Guns, killing twenty German soldiers, taking fifty prisoners and capturing seven hundred yards of German trenches.

For this feat he was awarded the Victoria Cross and the French Croix De Guerre. He also received another Croix De Guerre, this time 'With Palm'

It is proposed the sculpture will depict McCarthy jumping into the German Trench. The plaque will honour York servicemen and describe McCarthy VC's deeds of valour. The sculpture will include a map of France, on which will be marked all the places where Australia Soldiers earned Victoria Crosses in WW1.

MCCARTHY IS INCLUDED IN THE TOWN HALL HONOUR BOARD LISTING ALL THOSE FROM YORK WHO SERVED IN THE WAR. HE IS LISTED AS A VC.

THE SCULPTURE AND PLAQUE WILL BE ERECTED AT A PROMINENT PLACE IN THE TOWN OF YORK, PERHAPS ON AN EXTERNAL WALL OF THE TOWN HALL, A FOCAL POINT FOR LIFE IN YORK, WHERE IT WILL BE SEEN CONTINUALLY BY RESIDENTS AND VISITORS. THE TOWN HALL ~~HAS~~ ITSELF HAS A VERY DISTINCTIVE STYLE, AND IS THE BEST KNOWN BUILDING IN YORK. MOUNTING ON THE TOWN HALL WALL WILL ELIMINATE THE COST OF A PLINTH, WHICH COULD BE \$6,000 EXTRA.
